BOT Meeting Summary 02/21/2022 (Katie Goldstein, Rockville Campus Council Chair)

- Dr. Dukes last Board of Trustees meeting as the new President Dr. Jermaine F. Williams will take over the helm.
- There were three students who attended the meeting; one student who is studying architecture as well is an international student who spoke highly of student life at MC and their participation on the architectural club.
- COVID cases are going down and compliance is high.
- Montgomery College passed out a lot of KN95 masses to the college community.

- Montgomery college made it a priority to focus on the health of the Montgomery College community. The college made an important decision to move forward with the requirement ofall employees to have the COVID booster shot and the students will be required in the near future.
- Montgomery Colleges Interim President Dr. Charlene Dukes attended the AACC meeting with other community college leaders in Washington, DC. She represented the college as a panelist. Another important attendee was Dr. Jill Biden. One of the highlights was a decision on how other community colleges nationwide are experiencing enrollment challenges.
- The Board of Trustees presented several awards for recent retirees. They gave out bronze medallions and silver medallions for years of service with the college.
- Montgomery College obtained a new contract for cloud-based hosting service and the college is acquiring new software for asset management.
- The Board of Trustee scholarships are now based on each campus. Next year the college will remove the campus-based aspect so that more students will have a better opportunity.
- The Board of Trustees reflected on Dr. Dukes' accomplishments and what was completed through her time with the college and the exit of Dr. Pollard. Our new President, Dr. Jermaine F. Williams, that will start the end of February 2022. The next Board of Trustees meeting on March 21st will be attended by Alice Boatman, the Takoma Park Silver Spring Campus Council Chair.

- The senior leadership met frequently to discuss evolving issues with enrollment and to work towards a strategic outreach effort that included a calling campaign. The campaign was to encourage students to register, pay and to upload their vaccination card.
- As senior leadership takes a comprehensive approach to strategic enrollment management it
 allows Montgomery College the use of actionable intelligence to inform enrollment strategies
 and practices that will position Montgomery College strategically to achieve optimal enrollment
 results.
- The presentation is a layout of the fundamentals and to talk to the Council about understanding strategic enrollment management of SEM.
- The SEM mission is to manage Montgomery College enrollment which is directly tied to the institution's health and vitality.

- Montgomery College partnership with MCPS as the dual enrollment program as well as MCPS STEM Ready, Montgomery Can Code, Para Educator Teacher Prep Program and Dual Enrollment
 - Montgomery Can Code program is a collaboration between Montgomery county economic development and Apple.
 - o Para Educator Teacher Prep Program is to increase the diversity of MCPS teachers.
 - Dual Enrollment. MC has about 18,000 college course enrollments over 11,000 students
 18 different degrees the college offers.
 - 1. Open to all MCPS students.
 - Northwood high and Northwest high get to stay at their high school and take college courses or MCPS students can attend classes on all three Montgomery college campuses.
 - 3. To participate you must have 2.75 GPA.
 - 4. Receive your high school diploma and college degree.
 - 5. Certificate program.
 - 6. MCPS will fund 100% of their tuition and books.
 - 7. MC offers 15 degrees on all three campuses.
- This academic year was MC's largest enrollment with about 500 students enrolled in 3700 courses.
- Virtual middle college partnership MCPS. Brand new.
- Seminars to orientate HS students to e-learning (delivered by MC faculty and staff). Starts fall 2022 for college courses starting spring 2023
- 2021 graduation 77 middle college, 112 early college students
- 2022 2025 anticipate 600 middle college, P-Tech 200, early college 1,100 and virtual middle college 300.
