#### Call to Order

Chair Ernest Cartledge called the regular meeting to order at 2:13 p.m.

#### **Constituent Concerns**

No constituents addressed to the council.

#### Agenda

Ernest Cartledge noted the Academic Services Council agenda item would be postponed to a later date. A motion was made by Clemmie Solomon to accept the minutes as amended and accepted unanimously.

#### **Approval of Minutes**

The minutes from the September 19, 2019 were reviewed. Julie Levinson made a correction to the end time (4pm instead of 3:30pm) of the next meeting. A motion was made by Clemmie Solomon to accept the minutes as amended and accepted unanimously.

#### **New Business**

#### 2019-20 Goal Plan

Several ideas were raised by Council members (Julie Levinson, Benita Rashaw, Ernest Cartledge). Clemmie Solomon suggested the goal of increasing spectatorship at MC athletic events.

Clemmie Solomon motioned to for the Council to actively promote increasing spectator participation at winter sports games (mens/womens basketball). Dr. Rashaw seconded motion.

Discussion: Clemmie Solomon offered that athletics are part of student success at Montgomery College and financial resources generated by participation at events, more support goes to athletes. Also increases community engagement. Part of StAMP initiative.

Questions raised by: Nik Sushka, Tahrea Mensah, Julie Levinson and Benita Rashaw. Clarifying responses offered by Clevette Ridguard and Clemmie Solomon.

Motion amended to broaden to include all sports. Clemmie Solomon motioned to establish goal for "the "Council to support promoting spectator participation at athletic events." A motion was made by Clemmie Solomon to accept the stated goal and accepted unanimously.

Nik Sushka motioned to for "the Council to actively support financial aid in its efforts to promote FAFSA awareness." Tahrea Mensah seconded motion

Discussion: Discussion about what that would look like. Benita Rashaw talked about FAFSA fever and other outreach events, but will look to Judy Taylor for ideas.

A motion was made by Nik Sushka to accept the stated goal. Motion passed.

## **Constituent Concerns Updates**

Clevette Ridguard shared information about a "concerns" button now available to students via MyMC. The idea came out of student council, moved forward to College Council and approved by Dr. Pollard. An official communication will come out – likely in Inside MC before end of semester.

Clevette Ridguard clarified each council is expected to allot ten minutes for each meeting for constituent concerns (two slots for 5 minutes/each or no more than ten minutes). Time set aside to raise concern, but not necessarily to discuss at length. Template is available to use as a guide for how to handle constituent concerns.

Clevette Ridguard reported that 144 concerns came through governance in 2018-2019 academic year. All concerns categorized and by which council it came through noted in report. Data will be collected and reported again this year.
