 - Monthly emails with different scenarios
- SANS Mandatory Cyber training required this year. 651 out of 3285 completed
- Securing Windows 7, but going towards Windows 10. This calendar year all devices should be Windows 10
- Workday is on time, tracking well, January 2021 Employee/Mgr Self Service
- Banner will remain in place for students. Upgraded to 9.0
- Degree Works is in progress
