#### **Mark Eisenhower**

Mr. Mark Eisenhower is a graduate of Col. Zadok Magruder High School and has been the instrumental music teacher there since 1985. The Magruder bands and orchestras regularly earn Superior ratings at district and state festivals. He earned his Bachelor of Music Education degree from the University of Northern Colorado and taught for three years in Mitchell, Nebraska before returning to Montgomery County.

An active bass trombonist, Mr. Eisenhower has performed with the Capitol Wind Symphony and Trinity Chamber Orchestra. Mr. Eisenhower has conducted several Montgomery County Public Schools honors ensembles, serving as the conductor of the junior honor band in 1991 and the senior band in 1992. For the past several years he has prepared the senior honor band for notable guest conductors such as: Anthony Maiello, Eliott Del Borgo, Robert Cameron, Harlan Parker, and John Lynch. In 2004 he conducted the Anne Arundel County Mid-Level Honor Band. In 2010 he conducted the Calvert County Honor Band. For fourteen years he was the manager of the Maryland Senior All State Band, and in 2001 Mr. Eisenhower had the honor of conducting the Maryland Junior All State Band.

#### William J. Hollin

Now the Instrumental Music Director at The Barbara Ingram School for the Arts in Hagerstown, (Bill) Hollin is happy to be reunited with many of his old friends in the Maryland Band Directors Band after a 5-year hiatus in Missoula, Montana. While in Montana, he directed the school orchestras for Missoula County Public Schools at Hellgate and Sentinel High Schools and was the conductor and Music Director of the Missoula Youth Symphony, and Assistant Conductor for the Missoula City Band. His school groups consistently earned Superior ratings at Montana Music Festivals and were consistently singled out for special recognition for their superior level of performance. Originally from Montgomery County, Mr. Hollin graduated from Magruder High School and later became the Instrumental Director at Gaithersburg High School and later at Quince Orchard High School where the Orchestra, Marching Band, Symphonic Band and Jazz Band similarly earned superior ratings at District and State, and National adjudications.

He has also been a guest conductor and clinician for honor bands and orchestras both in Montana and Maryland. He has also returned as Music Director of the Director of the Potomac Valley Youth Orchestra.

Mr. Hollin earned his BS from Towson University and attended Illinois State University on an NSE Scholarship. He received his Master's degree from The University of Oklahoma where he was Graduate Assistant of Bands assisting with the Marching Band, directing the Concert Band, and leading the "Sooner Showmen" through the 1983 NCAA tournament. His graduate thesis *The Wilhelmian Marches; The Military Band Music of Richard Strauss* was later cited with recordings by *The Heritage of the March Society*.

Still an active French horn player, he also enjoys studying and researching Military history. His wife Robin teaches Health Occupations for the Washington County Schools and his sons Michael (French horn at The University of Oklahoma), and Joshua (string bass at Barbara Ingram HS) also maintain active musical lives.

# The Magruder High School Symphonic Band

The Magruder High School Symphonic Band comprises students in grades 10-12. The ensemble presents several concerts throughout the year as well as participating in festival adjudication. The band has received superior ratings over 20 times since Mr. Eisenhower began teaching at Magruder. In the fall the Symphonic Band is also the Magruder Marching Colonels. This group participates in marching competitions and has appeared in the National Cherry Blossom Parade and in seven Disney Magic Music Days parades.

## **Maryland Band Directors Band**

The Maryland Band Directors Band was created in 2011 by Dr. Vincent Patterson, several teachers from the Montgomery County Public Schools, and the Montgomery College Arts Institute in conjunction with Montgomery College's Workforce Development and Continuing Education division, the Montgomery County Public Schools, and the College's Rockville Music Department. It is a unique and valuable professional development class for music teachers.

Most of the members are music teachers from MCPS, private schools, and surrounding county schools, but there are also several outstanding community players and students from MC and MCPS who have been accepted by audition.

For MCPS teachers who have the Advanced Professional Certificate, participation in the class, which involves six rehearsals and two concerts per semester, earns continuing education units applicable to recertification requirements.

In the fall of 2012, the Professional Development Workshops & Institutes program at The Catholic University of America began offering a 3-credit graduate course, "Methods and Materials for Music Teachers," that uses membership in the Maryland Band Directors Band (or the Montgomery College Chorus) as a core element of the course. These graduate credits are eligible for use by teachers toward recertification, toward a Masters Equivalency status, or toward salary lane changes.

#### **Vincent Patterson**

Vincent Patterson is the founder and Director of the Maryland Band Directors Band. He earned the Doctor of Musical Arts Degree in conducting from Catholic University where he studied with outstanding teachers/conductors, including Frederick Fennell and Robert Garafalo. His degrees in instrumental performance and music education are from Millikin University. Enlisted in the U.S. Army, he taught for three years at the Armed Forces School of Music in Norfolk, VA. He is a former member of the U.S. Marine Band.
