### **Carol Trawick**

Throughout her life, Carol Trawick has devoted countless hours and personal resources to promoting the strength and viability of many arts organizations in Montgomery County. A former teacher, counselor, assistant principal and technology firm executive, she is now a trustee and the president of the Jim and Carol Trawick Foundation, through which she continues her work helping others. The foundation assists non-profit health and human service and arts organizations in Montgomery County. Montgomery College awarded her an honorary degree in 2010.

### **Robyn Kleiner**

As Director of Choirs, Ms. Kleiner oversees all the vocal ensembles and pit orchestras at Quince Orchard High School. Ms. Kleiner began with Montgomery County Public Schools in 2011 and has directed instrumental and vocal performing ensembles at Col. E Brooke Lee Middle School and Poolesville High School. Prior to her position in MCPS she studied both Choral and Instrumental Music Education at the Ohio State University in Columbus. As an undergraduate, Ms. Kleiner studied flute as well as percussion, and served as President of Sigma Alpha Iota and the Central Ohio Flute Association. Ms. Kleiner performs with many ensembles in the Montgomery County area, singing with The National Philharmonic Chorale and playing flute for various wind ensembles, including Flutes on the Brink, Maryland Band Directors Band, and Rockville Civic Band. During her time at QO, the choral program has grown from one choir to three diverse ensembles and she has served on the staff of the QO Marching Band and Drama Production Team. Ms. Kleiner remains an active member of National Association for Music Education, Maryland Music Educators Association, and the American Choral Directors Association.

### **Phillip Proctor**

As the Director of Bands at Quince Orchard High School, Mr. Phillip Proctor oversees the athletic bands and three concert/jazz ensembles, and teaches AP Music Theory. Prior to coming to QO in 2004, Mr. Proctor was a graduate teaching assistant at East Carolina University School of Music where he was Director of the ECU Basketball Pep Band and Conductor of the Concert Band. He has taught all age levels of students from elementary to college. During his time at Quince Orchard, Mr.Proctor has led the marching band to state championship titles in 2004, 2008, and 2012, and to numerous other regional awards, including the US Marine Corps prestigious Esprit de Corps award in 2011. The concert and jazz ensembles consistently receive superior ratings at adjudicated festivals. In 2008, Mr. Proctor had the honor of conducting the 2008 MCPS Junior All-County Honors Band. In addition to his duties in the music department, Mr. Proctor has served as the Faculty Elected Representative (2005-2008) and is currently the Gradebook/Pinnacle Advisor and Edline Administrator for Quince Orchard High School.

### Vincent Patterson

Dr. Vincent Patterson is a former member of the U.S. Marine Band, *The President's Own*, in Washington, D.C., and is the founder and director of the Maryland Band Directors Band. He earned the Doctor of Musical Arts in conducting from Catholic University where he studied with outstanding teachers/conductors, including Frederick Fennell and Robert Garafalo. His degrees in instrumental performance and music education are from Millikin University. After enlisting in the U.S. Army, he taught for three years at the Armed Forces School of Music in Norfolk, Virginia, before being accepted into the U.S. Marine Band.
