FALL 2019 OFFICIAL ENROLLMENT COLLEGEWIDE and CAMPUS OVERVIEW

- 21,260 students generated 191,610 bill hours and 6,387 FTES in credit courses in fall 2019.
 - 3,931, or 18.5%, are first-time-ever-in-college students
 - 1,171, or 5.5%, are transferred from other colleges
 - 15,187, or 71.4%, are returning students
 - 971, or 4.6%, are concurrently enrolled in high school
- Compared to fall 2018, student enrollment declined -2.1% (460 fewer students) and credit hours dropped -2.6% (5,190 fewer generated bill hours).
- **❖** 6,314 students take classes via distance education.
- Demographic Highlights
 - 65.6% attend part-time; 34.4% attend full-time
 - Nearly half (46.6%) are 20 years of age or younger
 - Average age: 24.4, with slight age differences by campus
 - 53.6% are female; 45.8% are male
 - Diversity of student body: 26.3% Black, 25.5% Hispanic, 22.0% White, 11.7% Asian, 3.3% Multi-Race, 0.6% Native American/Pacific Islander, 10.7% Foreign/Unknown
 - 25.2% are non-citizens
 - 22.3% of recent MCPS graduates (2,484) are enrolled at MC
 - 8.2% students report a disability
- The vast majority of student (16,243) attend classes on one campus; 2,935 travel between campuses to attend classes.

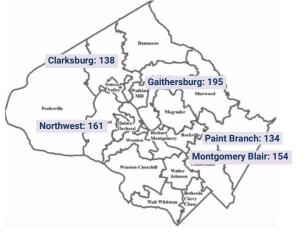

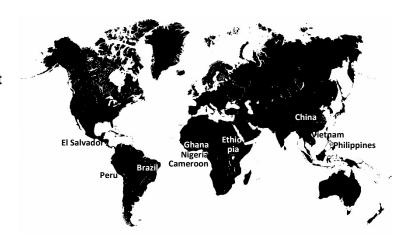
