FALL 2021 OFFICIAL ENROLLMENT COLLEGEWIDE and CAMPUS OVERVIEW

- ✤ 17,284 students generated 152,982 bill hours, or 5,099.4 FTES, in credit courses in fall 2021.
 - 2,958, or 17.1%, are first-time-ever-in-college students
 - 696, or 4%, are transferred from other colleges
 - 12,158, or 70.3%, are returning students
 - 1,472, or 8.5%, are concurrently enrolled in high school
- Compared to fall 2020, student enrollment declined -13.7% (2,753 fewer students) and credit hours dropped -14.6% (26,167 fewer generated bill hours).

Demographic Highlights

- Close to half (49.6%) are 20 years of age or younger
- 54.7% are female; 44.6% are male
- Diversity of student body: 26.4% Black, 26.4% Hispanic, 20.7% White
- 17% of recent MCPS graduates (2,047) are enrolled at MC

Highlights of Selective Student Cohorts:

- First-time-ever-in-college (FTEIC) enrollment declined 17.6% (630 fewer students)
- 17% of recent MCPS graduates enrolled in MC, a decline of 4 percentage points
- Transfer-in student enrollment declined 23.3% (212 fewer students)
- F-1 Visa student enrollment declined 28.6% (134 fewer students)
- 47% of Fall 2020 students enrolled in Fall 2021

Enrollment Pattern Highlights

- 66.4% attend part-time; 33.6% attend full-time
- 39% attended a distance learning course
- 24% attended a course offered in the first 7-week session
- 30% attended an evening course
