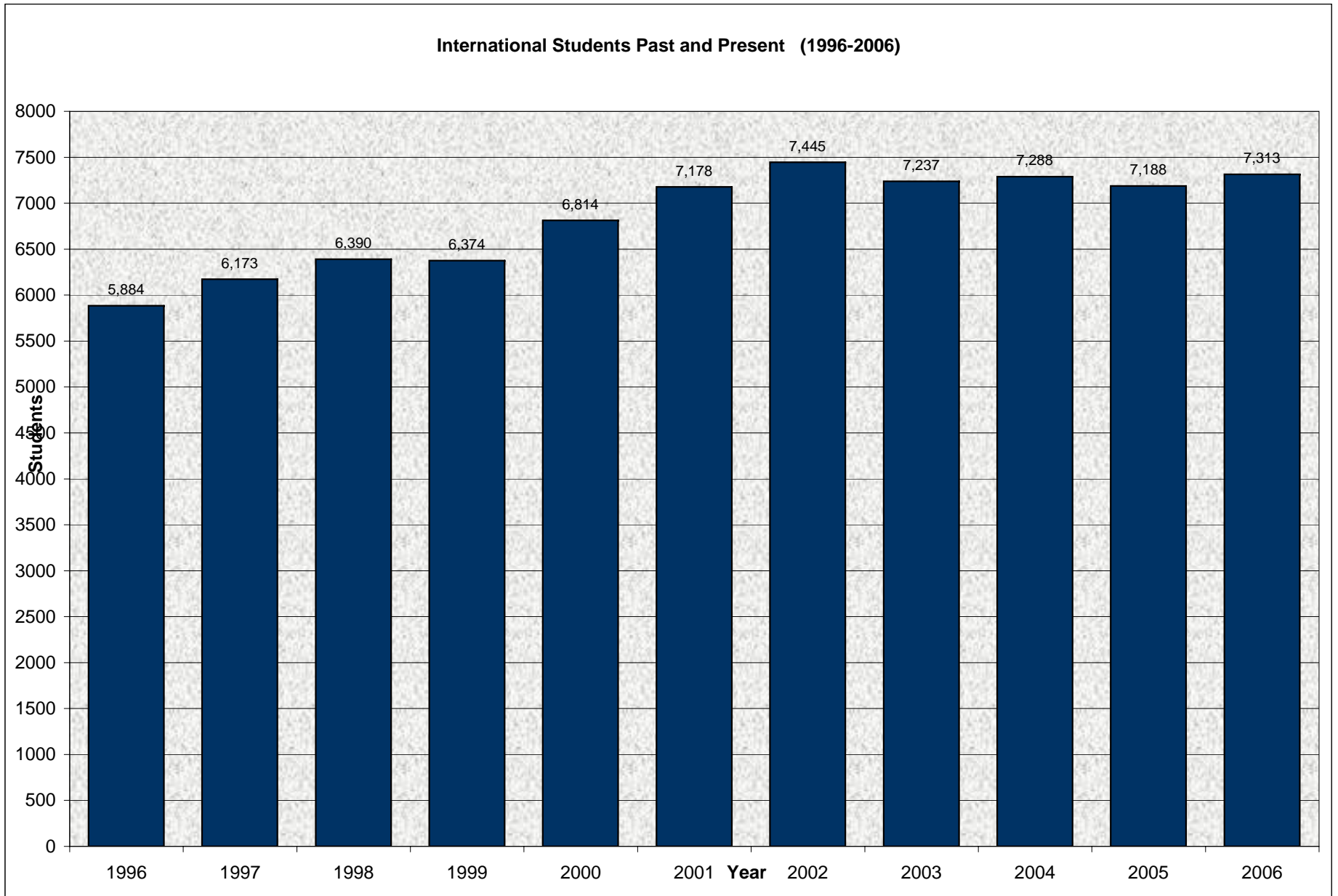

In an effort to provide better, more standard disability definitions for the MACC (Maryland Association of Community Colleges) Databook, the Task Force on Community College Students with Disabilities recommended the addition of seven categories. As a result, the five year comparison of the "disabilities reported" was discontinued due to lack of matching comparison data.
