* "First attempt" is the first attempt at Montgomery College.

"Successful" is defined as a grade of "C" or better.

"Immediate retention rate" is the number and percentage of students returning in the following spring.

"Returned within 2 years" is the number and percentage of students taking any course at MC in the subsequent 2 years.

"Completed RD099 within two years" includes summer sessions up to the fall term two years from cohort formation.

"Achieve threshold" is the number and percentage of students passing EN101 or its equivalent within 2 yrs of their first attempt in RD099.

"Academic Progress" is the number and percentage of students earning a GPA \geq 2.0 for at least 15 credits at MC. "Comprehensive" includes any work completed prior to their first attempt in RD099 up to the end of the spring term 3 academic years after this first attempt.

"Degree w/in 3 years" is similar to the criteria used for the federal Graduation Rate Survey and Student Right to Know. These allow for 150% of the time to complete a degree.

"Degree w/in 4 years" allows students an additional year to complete a degree or certificate. Many of our students require more than the federal guideline of 150% of time to complete a degree.
