## **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

***In fall 2009, student and credit hour enrollments increased 6.9% and 8.5% respectively. There were 26,147 students taking 242,381 credit hours. Since fall 2000, Montgomery College has experienced growth rates of 25% in student population and 37% in total credit hour enrollments, and has grown 17% in students and 22% in hours since Fall 2005. Montgomery College continues to enroll the largest number of credit students of any Maryland community college and is second only to UMCP in the number of undergraduates at Maryland higher education institutions.***

All three campuses showed increases in the numbers of students and credit hour enrollments from last fall. The Germantown Campus had the largest percentage increase in numbers of students; Takoma Park/Silver Spring increased the most in hours of enrollment. Distance Learning enrollments continued to increase as well – they were up some 10% from last fall.

Black, Asian, Hispanic, American Indian, and “Multi-Race” students make up over 65% of the student body.

The number of younger students continues to increase; the average (mean) age dropped to 25.9 and 42% of the students are aged 20 or younger.

The number of male students increased proportionately more than females, and males now comprise 46% of all students.

More than one-third (39.7%) of the students are attending full-time (12 or more credits); average credit load is 9.27 hours – up from 9.14 last fall.

Fewer students – only 14% - attend classes only in the evening, more than half (61%) attend only in the daytime, and 22% take both day and evening classes. About four percent of students were in Distance Learning courses only.

Nine of every ten students (89.2%) are Montgomery County residents; the proportion of out-of-county students decreased slightly to 4.4%, and out-of-state students remain constant at 6.5%.

The College’s draw rate of June 2009 Montgomery County public high school graduates was 26.4% – up from 25.2% last year.

About 57% of the students are enrolled in Transfer programs (more than half of those students are in General Studies), about 19% are in Career/Technology programs, and 25% have not indicated a program of study, or are not pursuing a degree or certificate.

There were 8,096 non-U.S. Citizens enrolled this fall and represent 179 individual “Countries of origin or Areas;” 956 of them were on foreign student (F-1) visas.

The number of students reporting some type of disability increased by 45 students from last year to 1,111 students.
