EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

In fall 2011, student and credit hour enrollments increased 3.8% and 2.5% respectively. There were 26,996 students taking 246,464 credit hours. Since fall 2007, Montgomery College has experienced growth rates of 13% in student population and total credit hour enrollments.

All three campuses showed increases in both number of students and hours of enrollment. Germantown increased by 4.9% in students and 2.0% in hours, while Rockville increased by 3.7% and 2.6%, respectively, and Takoma Park/Silver Spring increased 3.4% and 2.7% in students and hours. Distance Education enrollments continued their annual increase – this fall the number of students enrolled in 100% online courses increased by 13% and the hours of enrollment were up some 5% from last fall.

Black, Asian, Hispanic, American Indian, and “Multi-Race” students make up 68% of the student body.

The number of younger students continues to increase; the average (mean) age dropped to 25.76 and 41% of the students are aged 20 or younger.

The number of male students increased proportionately more than females, and males comprise 46.8% of all students.

More than one-third (36.0%) of the students are attending full-time (12 or more credits); average credit load is 9.13 hours – down from 9.24 last fall.

Fewer students – only 13% - attend classes only in the evening, more than half (62%) attend only in the daytime, and 21% take both day and evening classes. About five percent of students were in Distance Education courses only.

Nine of every ten students (90.1%) are Montgomery County residents; the proportion of out-of-county students increased slightly to 4.7%, and out-of-state students decreased to 5.2 %.

The College’s draw rate of June 2011 Montgomery County public high school graduates was 25.8% – up from last year’s 25.0% yield.

About 59% of the students are enrolled in Transfer programs (more than half of those students are in General Studies), about 20% are in Career/Technology programs, and 21% have not indicated a program of study, or are not pursuing a degree or certificate.

There were 8,083 non-U.S. Citizens enrolled this fall and they represent 171 individual “countries of origin;” Using a more traditional definition of “International Students,” the College enrolled 1,907 such students this fall, and 845 of them were on foreign student (F-1) visas.

The number of students reporting some type of disability increased by 53 students from last year to 1,273 students this fall.

There were 9,351 students (35%) receiving some form of financial aid; 6,594 (24% of all students) received Pell Grants.
