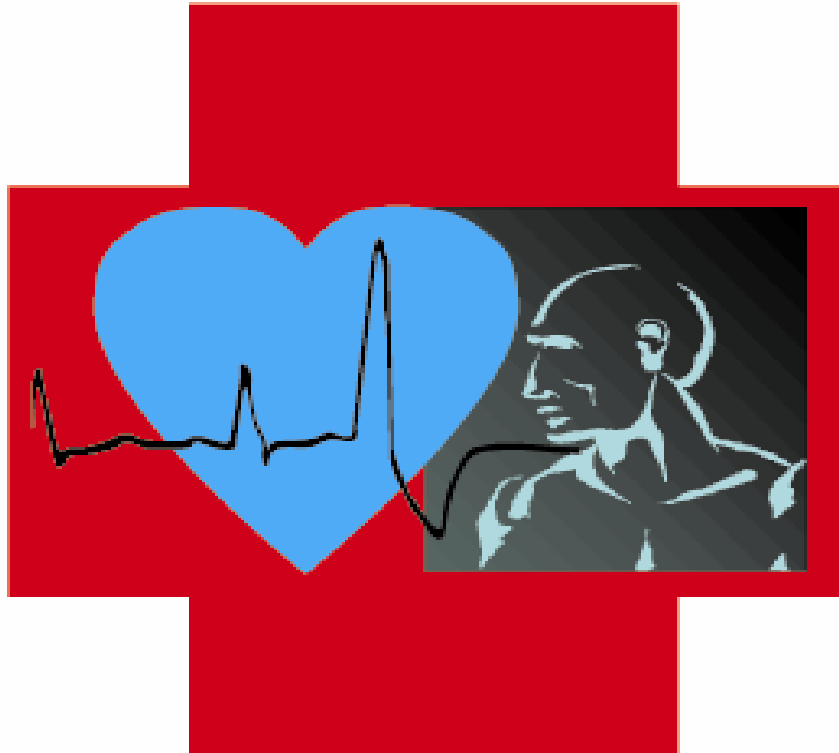

Health Sciences Checklist

Obtaining your education in one of our six Health Sciences programs can start you on a rewarding career in the medical field. Graduates of our programs are competent and prepared to apply to take the various certification examinations to be successful in the medical community. To get started, complete the following steps.

1. Attend an Information Session

Attend an Information Session for your area of interest. It is in your best interest to attend an Information Session so that you will understand the rigor and time commitments needed to be successful in these programs. Times and dates can be found at www.montgomerycollege.edu/healthsciences.

2. Visit the Office of Admissions

Submit a general admission application with a non-refundable \$25 fee, and if applicable, official copies of your college transcripts to the Office of Admissions for review. Once you receive your transcript evaluation, it will help you to ensure that courses are not duplicated. Make sure you obtain a college catalog and review which classes you will need to take.

3. Make an appointment for a TEAS Test for Nursing Program

Before applying to the Nursing Program, you must meet minimum academic requirements (see application). To assess these skills, set up an appointment to take the TEAS test at the testing center or at any institution that offers the test. 4. See a Counselor

If you have questions about your coursework or need help creating an academic plan, meet with a counselor at the Takoma Park/Silver Spring Campus. ***Be sure to complete steps 1-3 first!***

5. Apply to a Program

Once you have completed all of your requirements, submit your Health Sciences application to the Office of Admissions before the deadline: April 1st for Fall Admissions (all programs) or July 1st for Spring Admissions for Nursing only.

Admission Requirements--Please read carefully.

Montgomery College Health Sciences programs requiring this application are available ONLY at the Takoma Park Campus. (Please note: there are two applications-one for admission to the college and this application.) In order to apply, you must meet all of the following requirements before applying:

- You must submit an application for general admission to Montgomery College along with a \$25 non-refundable fee (if not previously admitted.)
- You are strongly encouraged to attend an Information Session for your area(s) of interest.
- **Minimum requirements needed:** EN 101 assessment level or prior completion of EN 101/101A/102 or 109, MA 110 assessment level or prior completion of MA 100 or higher, BI 107, and for DMS applicants only, PH 010 or higher.
- Must have a minimum GPA of 2.50 for consideration. This GPA is based on your most recent 24 college credits earned.
Effective Spring 2009 Admission- GPA will be used for eligibility purposes only and you must complete the TEAS admissions test (**Nursing Applicants Only**) and attach scores to this application. You must have a minimum score of 50% on the Reading, Science, and English sections and a minimum score of 30% on the Math section. This test can only be taken twice a year.
- It is to your advantage to **complete** all the courses below to increase your chance of admission to your program of interest. Applicants who have completed all of the courses in their program of choice will be given first consideration over those students who have completed fewer than all the courses listed in the program of interest. **You may have fewer courses completed to apply or even no courses completed, although as stated above, all courses completed improves your chances of admission. - Students who transfer with BI 204 and/or BI 205 will not need to complete BI 107.
- *Please refer to the college catalog to review course prerequisites.

Beginning with the Fall 2008 class, Health Sciences admissions will be based on courses completed and grades earned through the prior fall semester only. Spring admission (Nursing only) will be based on courses and grades completed through the prior spring semester only.

III. Notice of Additional Enrollment Requirements (subject to change)

All candidates who are offered admission to a Health Sciences Program should be aware of and prepared to meet these additional requirements prior to enrollment and licensing.

- Must understand and meet all requirements and/or standards imposed by recognized professional societies and all contract requirements imposed on College students by the institution or agency where the clinical practice is to occur.
- Must understand and be prepared to meet all requirements for participation in certain clinical courses involving hospital or clinical practice. These requirements may include the passing of an appropriate health examination and tests per CDC guidelines, e.g.: (1) complete blood count; (2) urinalysis; (3) a complete hepatitis B vaccination series (series of three or waiver); (4) annual TB screening; (5) MMR vaccination(s) or positive titer(s); and (6) varicella vaccination or a varicella titer. The facility or clinical site may also require drug testing and/or a criminal background check which are acceptable to the facility or clinical site before beginning the student's clinical rotations.
- Must understand participation in certain clinical courses may require a current BASIC LIFE SUPPORT (BLS) provider certification that meets standards acceptable to the facility or clinical site before beginning the student's Clinical Rotations.
