Montgomery College GENERAL EDUCATION COURSES 2008-09

Montgomery College General Education courses will transfer without question to Maryland public colleges and universities.

Students who wish to transfer to **private or out-of-state institutions** should not assume that all MC general education courses will transfer readily to all schools. **ALL students who wish to transfer** should seek advisement each semester before registering - some course choices below will vary by majors. All courses on this list will satisfy requirements for an associate's degree at MC.

For students who are interested in transfer to private or out-of-state, courses listed in **bold & italics** are generally more transferable to most institutions. Remember, all courses on the lists below will transfer successfully to Maryland public four-year schools, but for students considering private & out-of-state schools, it may be safest to stay with **italicized** courses. Specific majors will often dictate course choices in General Education – refer to individual school catalogs if a major or transfer destination is known. Plan with a Montgomery College advisor.

FOUNDATION COURSES – four courses total:

- ___ 1) **English: EN 102 Techniques/Reading & Writing or EN 109 Writing for Technology & Business** – 3 credits. MC's EN 101 is a prerequisite for either EN 102 or 109.
- ___ 2) **Math: MA 110 or higher** - check w/ transfer institution. Take the highest level of math possible if undecided, based on placement testing or SAT score (Math 550+).

- ___ 3) **Speech: SP 108 Fundamentals of Speech or SP 112 Business & Prof. Comm.**- 3 credits
- ___ 4) **Health: HE 100 Principles of Healthier Living** - 1 credit; or any course, 1 – 3 credits, with an HE designator. Some schools prefer a 3-credit HE course if a Health requirement exists.
- ___ * **Multicultural Course Requirement** – choose one 3-credit course with a * from any Distribution Area to satisfy the MC Multicultural Requirement.
