These Montgomery College courses transfer into General Education Programs without question at Maryland public colleges & universities under the Maryland Higher Education Commission's (MHEC) transfer agreement. This policy does not apply to private or out-of-state schools. To keep transfer opportunities open at schools *outside of the Maryland public system*, consider taking courses listed in ***bold & italics*** (these have demonstrated greater transferability to general education programs at private and out-of-state schools). The major(s) you're considering may also require specific courses in General Education – refer to individual school catalogs if a major or transfer destination is known. <input type="checkbox"/> 2. Mathematics: MA 110 or higher. Choose by possible majors; if unknown, take the highest level math based on placement/SAT scores. MA 130 may not fulfill a math requirement at other schools unless your major is Education.	<input type="checkbox"/> 4. Health: Take a 1- to 3-credit HE course. A 3-credit course is preferred by schools with a Health requirement.

Multicultural (noted with an * asterisk) – take one course from among choices, required for AA , AAT, and AS degrees.

ARTD - Distribution Courses: Choose one or two courses, depending on major/transfer school. Most programs require one arts course and two humanities (next page). Previously, it was recommended that engineering students take only theory-based arts courses for transfer to UMCP; now, all courses (except CG 120) will transfer as Arts for engineering.
