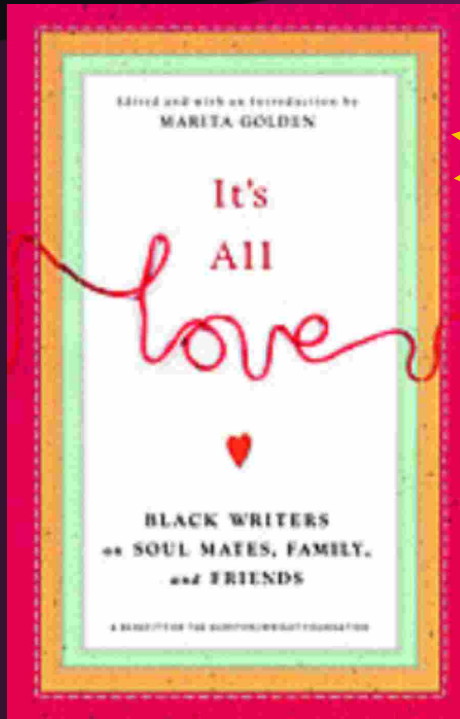

In a professional writing career that spans more than thirty years, Marita Golden has distinguished herself as a novelist, essayist, teacher of writing and literary institution builder.

Her fiction includes the novel *AFTER* (winner of the 2007 Award for fiction from the Black Caucus of the American Library Association). Her most recent book is *It's All Love*. All of Marita Golden's texts are widely read and used in college courses that represent a wide range of disciplines, from literature, African American Studies, and anthropology to Women's Studies.

As a teacher of writing, Marita Golden has held appointments at George Mason University and Virginia Commonwealth University, where she served as a member of the MFA Graduate Creative Writing programs. She has also taught at Emerson College, The University of Lagos (Nigeria), Roxbury Community College, and American University. Currently, Ms. Golden serves as Writer in Residence at the University of the District of Columbia, in Washington, D.C.

Marita Golden founded and served as the first president of the Washington-D.C. based African American Writers Guild. In 1990 she co-founded the Zora Neale Hurston/Richard Wright Foundation, which presents the nation's only national fiction award for college writers of African descent and an annual summer writer's workshop for Black writers, Hurston/Wright Writers' Week, as well as the Hurston/Wright Legacy Award for published Black writers. She now serves as President Emeritus of the organization.
