Title: Helping Students Get to Know You

Description: Students often forget their professors have lives outside the classroom. So, help them see the "human" side of you with a family, interests, etc. Some examples of what to share:

- your ethnic or cultural background (if com-fortable),
- what led you to teaching and the academic discipline,
- your teaching style (what do you expect of the students and of yourself)
- photos of you engaged in activities outside of the classroom
- a personal story or experience, particularly from your own college /learning experience

Advantage: Sharing this information might help you connect with students, which could be useful when seeking ways to motivate them.
