Goals: (1) Students become familiar with each other, and, therefore, more likely to feel comfortable speaking in class (2) Students develop an understanding of their classmates' identities	Variation: Have students do this in pairs or groups and report to the class their partners' object and how it represents them or their cultural group.
Description: I ask my students to take out an object (artifact) from their bag or wallet and use it to explain how it represents them as an individual or as a member of their cultural group.	Challenges: Some students may not have a representative object. In this situation, I allow students to take out a photo, either print or digital, if they have one which serves the same purpose.
One thing I also do for students who are stuck is to share my own objects. Sometimes it might be a keychain or even the key for my car, or my necklace which has a charm on it. I don't want to give too much help that might replace their own ability to think through what works for them.
