Title: Question Answer Strategies

Goals: To prepare students to approach different types of questions.

Description: Taking an exam involves not only understanding the con-tent but also knowing how to answering questions. To help students pre-pare for an exam, inform them of the types of questions they will encounter (multiple-choice, essay, etc.) and how to approach these questions.

Example:

- For multiple-choice questions, remind students to:
 - o read all the multiple-choice questions first, before reading the text. Then, as you read, answer the questions one-by-one when you find the answer. After you finish reading, double-check to make sure you have answered questions correctly. Decide which multiple-choice questions are quickest to answer. Answer those first. Then, answer the questions that take longer to answer.
- For fill-in-the-blank questions, remind students to:
 - read the whole sentence, even the part that comes after the blank. Then, decide whether the word miss-ing is a noun, adjective, adverb, or verb. If there is a word bank, look at the options and choose from those words that are the same part of speech.
