



How to Cite (APA and MLA Styles) JOURNALS, MAGAZINES, NEWSPAPERS

APA (American Psychological Association) Style (see other side for MLA)

EXAMPLES are single-spaced; **double-space** citations in your reference list. Title and volume numbers are *italicized*.

JOURNAL ARTICLE Pages by Issue	Author. (Year). Title of article. <i>Title of journal</i> . Vol. (Issue), Pages.	Hallin, D.C. (2000). Sound bites news. <i>Journal of Communication</i> , 42(2), 5-24.
JOURNAL ARTICLE Multiple Authors <small>Note: list all authors up to six then for subsequent authors abbreviate as et. al.</small>	Author, Author, & Author. (Year). Title of article. <i>Title of Journal</i> . Vol. (Issue), Pages.	White, S., Johnson, A., & Smith, C. (2001). Laughter and stress. <i>Humor</i> , 6(3), 22-25.
MAGAZINE ARTICLE	Author. (Year, Month) Title of article. <i>Title of Magazine</i> , Vol., Pages.	Lavelle, M. (1999, Nov.) Behind the teen birth decline. <i>U.S. News&World Report</i> , 50, 63-65.
NEWSPAPER ARTICLE	Author. (Year, Month, Day). Title of article. <i>Title of Newspaper</i> , Pages.	Hall, T. (2001, February 24). IQ Scores are up. <i>New York Times</i> , pp. F1, F5.

JOURNAL ARTICLE Multiple Authors	Author, Author, and Author. "Title of article." <u>Title of journal</u> . Vol. (Year): Pages.	White, Sabina, Andrew Johnson, and Carol Smith. "Laughter and Stress." <u>Humor</u> 6 (2001): 22-25.
MAGAZINE ARTICLE	Author. "Title of article." <u>Title of magazine</u> Day Month Year: Pages.	Lavelle, Marianne. "Behind the Teen Birth Decline." <u>U.S. News&World Report</u> 8 Nov. 1999: 22.
NEWSPAPER ARTICLE	Author. "Title of article." <u>Title of Newspaper</u> . Day Month Year, Edition (if specified): Page (for consecutive pages, write only first page number with a + sign)	Hall, Trish. "IQ Scores are Up." <u>New York Times</u> 24 Feb. 2000, late ed.: F1+
