## START HERE, Transfer Anywhere

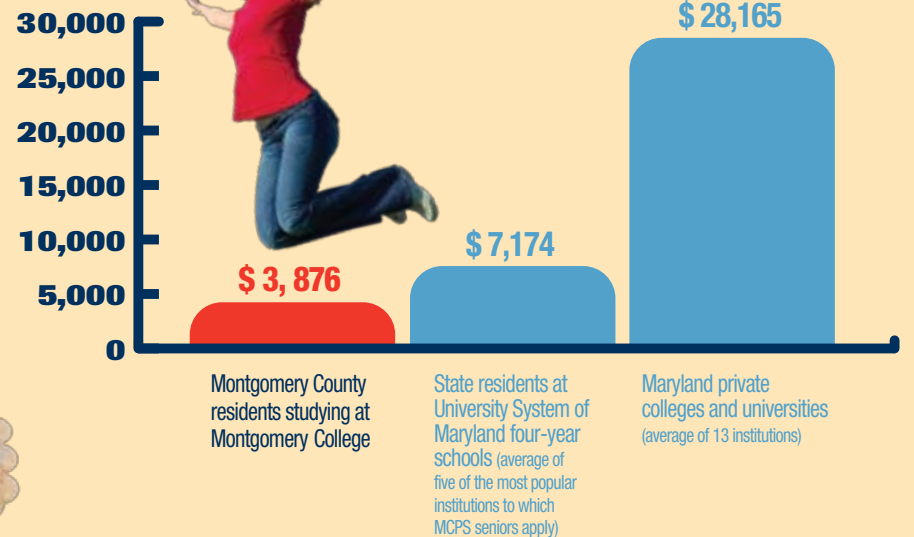

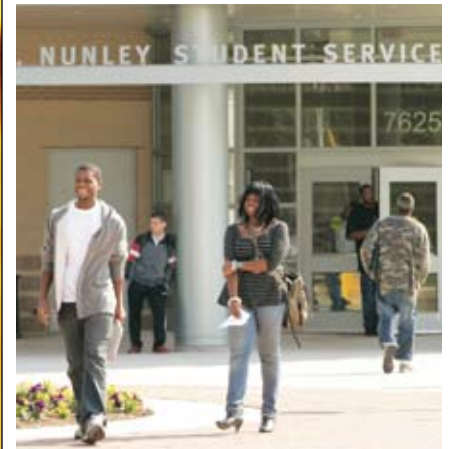
