**GED CLASSES FOR MONTGOMERY COUNTY ADULTS, WHO NEED TO GET THEIR  
HIGH SCHOOL DIPLOMA.**

**To Register:**

1. Decide when you can go to class—day, night, or Saturday.
2. Check the schedule, and choose a center that has classes at the time you can attend.
3. Go to the site in person, on the date, and at the time that is listed for class registration. Do **not** bring children to registration or testing.
4. At registration, you will participate in the program orientation and take the Life Skills, (CASAS Math) test. You will be given additional information as to when to return to the site for a free academic Mathematics placement test and the Language Arts Life Skills exam. **You must take all three tests.** This is to determine your proper class level either, Adult Basic Education, Pre-GED or GED.
5. GED level students **must** pay tuition; all other levels are free.
6. Students Textbooks for personal use will be available for purchase the bookstore during the first week of class.

Attending the Community Info session is recommended, though it is **not** mandatory to go to one before registering for classes.

**Please Note:**

For students to be eligible for GED classes they must be age 16 years or older, a Montgomery County resident, and not enrolled in a private or public high school. If currently attending high school, you **must** be officially withdrawn before enrolling in our program. If you are in possession of a high school diploma you received in another country, it is valid in the USA and you do not need to take GED classes. If the document is in another language however, you would need to get it translated into English before you could apply to a college.
