Human Origins: The Biological and Cultural Evolution of Our Species

This course traces the origins and evolution of humans from the earliest upright-walking hominid ancestors in Africa six million years ago, through the appearance of larger-brained, tool-makers of the genus, Homo, just over two million years ago, to the appearance of modern humans some two hundred thousand years ago and their subsequent migrations out of Africa and throughout the Old and New Worlds. It follows the earliest stone-working cultural efforts through discoveries such as the use of fire through the late Ice Age achievements of the cave artists of southwestern Europe and the first Asian migrants to the New World and looks critically at the latest field and laboratory discoveries. Discussions will include the scientific techniques and interpretative approaches that paleoanthropologists and archaeologists use to resolve issues concerning dates, evolutionary relationships, and ancient lifeways. Tuition waiver applies; seniors pay fee only.

Japan before the Japanese: Discover the Ainu of Japan

Long before the people who would become the Japanese migrated to the Japanese Islands, the indigenous Ainu people occupied the islands, developing a distinctive culture of their own, including sea-faring traditions. The Ainu people have survived into the 21st century. However, the roots of the Ainu ancestors were spread far more widely across eastern Asia and along the Pacific Rim, and very possibly on both sides of the Pacific. Italian for Opera Lovers

Now in its 8th year, *Italian for Opera Lovers* will present Verdi's masterpiece *Aida*, composed on the occasion of the building of the Suez Canal which had a significant effect on the history of Egypt. An all-time favorite this opera is known for its well-known arias *Celeste Aida*, *Ritorna vincitor* and *O patric mia* and a series of powerful duets culminating with the heartbreaking entombment scene. Also to be presented is *Vincenzo Bellini's Norma* which is memorable especially for the aria, *Casta Diva*, sung by the great Maria Callas. To better appreciate these musical masterpieces the students will read the libretto in Italian to ensure precise pronunciation and a deep meaning of the text in the native language. To facilitate discussion there will be exercises in Italian based on the libretto and background information concerning the life and the music of the composers. *Prerequisites include a love of opera and a basic knowledge of Italian with*

a strong desire to continue the study of the language. Consideration will be given to the linguistic competence level of each student. In addition to materials for studying Italian, the text *Parliamo italiano*, 2nd edition is required
