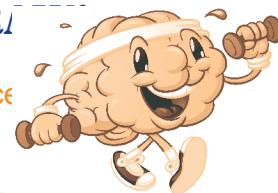

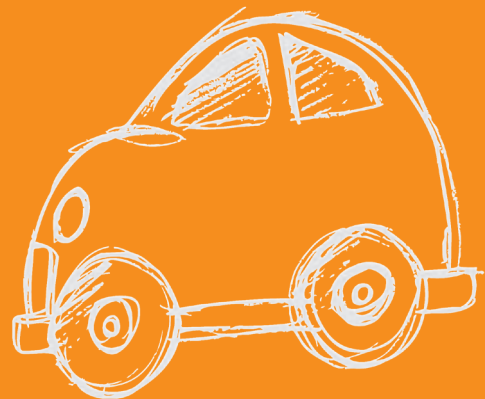

By Car:

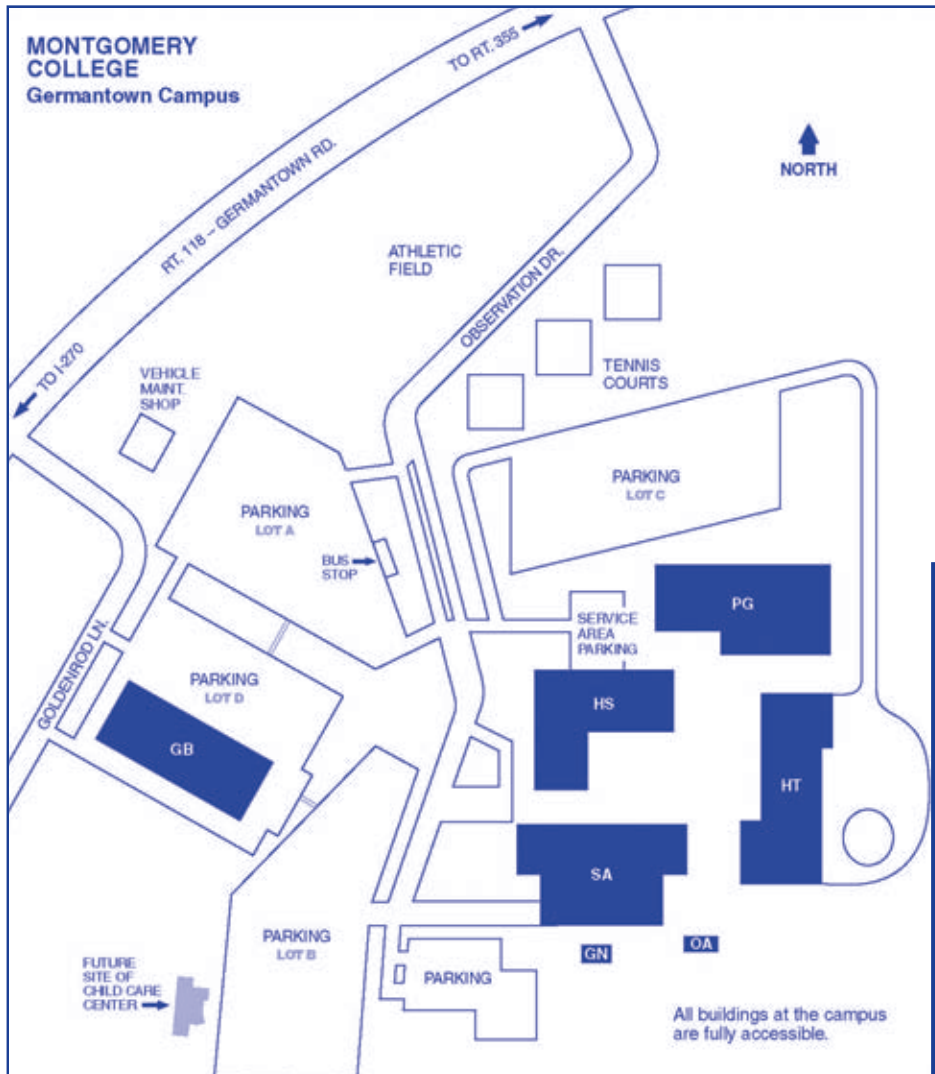
Take I-270 to Exit 15 East (Route 118). Continue to the second traffic light at Observation Drive; turn right onto campus.

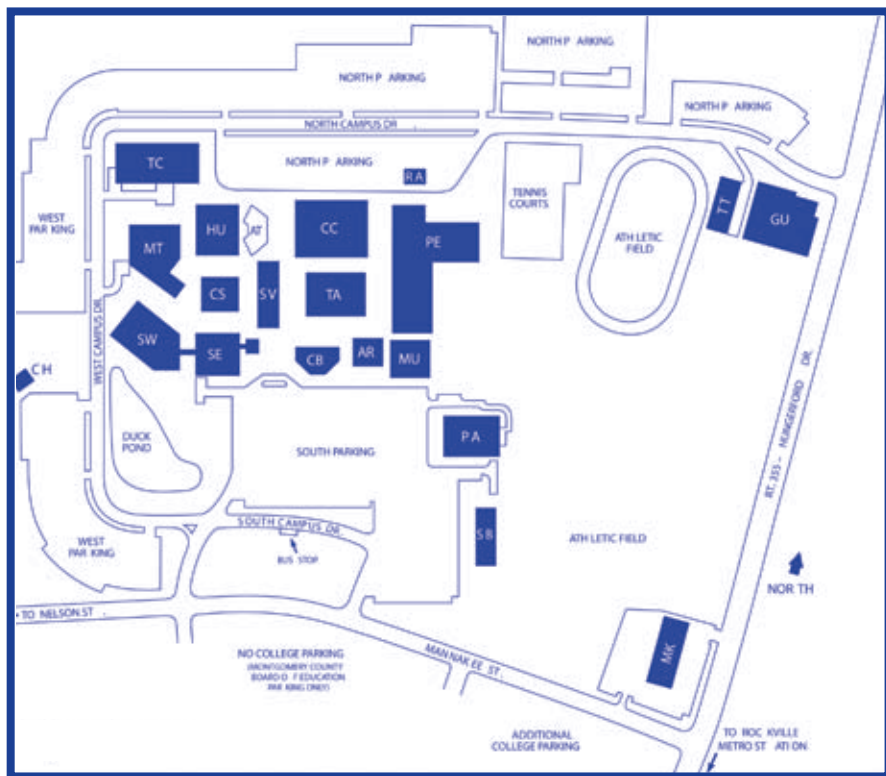

By Car

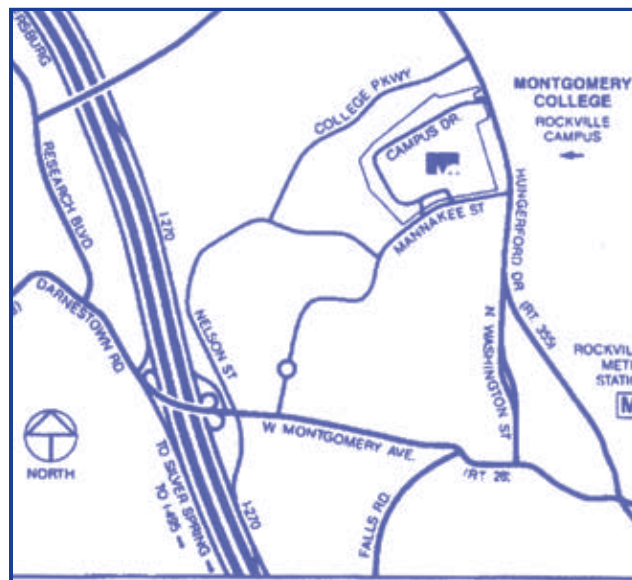
From the North: Take I-270 South to Exit 6 (Route 28), W. Montgomery Ave./Rockville. Then take Exit 6A (Route 28) East. Turn left at first traffic light onto Nelson Street. Go to first traffic light at Mannakee Street; turn left. The campus is 1.5 blocks on the left.

From the South: Take I-495 to I-270 North/Frederick. Exit on 6A (Route 28, W. Montgomery Ave./Rockville) 1/4 mile north of Montrose Road exit. Follow Montgomery College sign through traffic light (road becomes Nelson Street). Go to first traffic light at Mannakee Street; turn left. The campus is 1.5 blocks on the left.

Public Transportation to Rockville Campus

By Metro— Take the Red Line train to Rockville station, then transfer to Metrobus #Q2 (Viers Mill Road Line) to campus stop at corner of Hungerford Drive and Mannakee Street.

By Bus—Take Metrobus #Q2 (Viers Mill Road Line which runs between Silver Spring and Shady Grove Metro stations) to campus stop at corner of Hungerford Drive and Mannakee Street.



GENERAL INFORMATION & REGISTRATION OPTIONS

Please follow these instructions. Use one form for each student.

1. Make course selection(s).
2. Register online using your credit card (VISA, MasterCard, or Discover) at www.montgomerycollege.edu/youth.
3. OR download and complete a Registration Form. Be sure to include student's MC Identification Number.
4. For courses indicated as Gifted and Talented [GT], an additional signed form by the students school Principal is required. You can download this form at http://www.montgomerycollege.edu/wdce/youthpdf/YouthPrograms_GT.pdf.
5. Complete signature line, make check payable to Montgomery College for the total amount due, and mail registration form and check to: Montgomery College, Workforce Development & Continuing Education, Kids' College, 51 Mannakee Rockville, MD 20850. Visa, MasterCard, American Express, and Discover are also accepted for payment. You may choose to FAX completed registration form indicating VISA, MasterCard, American Express, or Discover payment to 240-567-7548. Walk-in registrations for Youth Programs must be processed in the Workforce Development & Continuing Education office, Rockville Campus, Campus Center, Room 220. Registrations for Youth Programs can not be processed at the College registration office.
6. **Registrants will be enrolled in the order that registration and payments are received.** Therefore, we urge you to register as early as possible to avoid disappointment. **You will receive acknowledgment of registration.** Please call Customer Service at 240-567-5188 if Registration Confirmation is NOT received at least five days before the start of classes. Classrooms and specific locations will be stated on this acknowledgement. Courses may be canceled due to low enrollment.
7. All students must register prior to attending class; do not attend class if you have not registered in advance.
8. Pending funding, partial scholarships may be available for Montgomery County students who demonstrate financial need or qualify for free or reduced lunch. Call 240-567-7264 or 240-567-7917 for information.

Residency Policy

The following are general guidelines taken from the College policy on residency for tuition purposes. A copy of the policy is available in the Montgomery College Catalog.

- A. Students attending Montgomery College will pay tuition according to their residency.
- B. To qualify for tuition purposes as a resident of the state of Maryland, legal domicile must have been maintained for a period not less than three months prior to the first regularly scheduled class. Non-Maryland residents must pay a \$25.00 out-of-state fee.
- C. The domicile of a person registering in a noncredit course at Montgomery College shall be considered as a person's permanent place of abode, where physical presence and possessions are maintained, and where he/she intends to remain indefinitely.
- D. Non-U.S. citizens must submit copy of passport visa or permanent resident card.
- E. Non-Maryland residents pay "Out-of-State" fees.

Refund Policy

Youth Programs Only: Class Transfer and/or Class Withdrawal/Drop Fees

1. **Class Transfer Requests:** Students will be allowed to transfer from one class to another, one time without a charge. Any additional schedule changes will be reviewed and may be subject to a \$20.00 fee.
2. **Youth Class withdrawal/drop request:** Parents who wish to withdraw their child from a course will receive 100 percent refund if written request is received at Montgomery College at least 6 days prior to the start of the class. Requests to withdraw from a class received within 5 days of the start of the class or after the start of class will be subject to a fee of \$50.00.
3. Requests for refunds may be completed by e-mailing the Youth Programs office at sharon.wolfgang@montgomerycollege.edu or karla.espinoza@montgomerycollege.edu or by calling 240-567-7264 or 240-567-7917. Please allow 3–4 weeks for refunds.
