#### **Piano for the Five-Year-Old**

This course is for kindergarten students. Children will experience music through prereading and rhythmic activities involving participation both at and away from the piano. They will learn several pieces by rote as well as create their own music through improvisation. This beginning course is the first in a four-level program.

## **Piano for the First Grader**

Students must be presently enrolled in first grade. Children will be introduced to prereading and rhythmic skills through songs, body movement, flashcards, and hand-to-hand playing skills in both large and small motor movements. Beginning concepts in expression, style, and interpretation will be explored. The students' musical vocabulary will be developed. Children will begin to use their creative skills by composing every week. Several songs will be taught by rote. Having a piano at home is not required, but access to an electronic keyboard (full-size keys, five-octave minimum) is strongly suggested. This beginning course is first in a three-level program.

Students in 2nd and 3rd grades will learn, at an accelerated pace, the fundamentals of piano playing. They will also learn music theory, notes reading and writing, and will receive basic ear training. Several piano pieces from various music styles will be discussed and played. Students will also be encouraged to create their own songs.

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## **Playing/Composing in the Percussion Orchestra (Grades 4–6)**

Saturdays, February 27–May 15 (no class 3/27 & 4/3)

Tuition \$110 + Fee \$50 = \$160; Non-Md. residents add \$120

Learn to play a variety of types of music on rhythm instruments—from classical and folk to rock and popular music. Learn how to improvise and compose your own pieces. Play in an ensemble (rhythm orchestra) and join in a performance at the end of the session. Basic keyboard knowledge is desirable, but not necessary.

Visa, MasterCard, and Discover are also accepted for payment. You may choose to FAX completed registration form indicating VISA, MasterCard, or Discover payment to 240-567-7548. Walk-in registrations for Youth Programs must be processed in the Workforce Development & Continuing Education office, Rockville Campus, Campus Center, Room 220. Registrations for Youth Programs can't be processed at the College registration office.
4. **Registrants will be enrolled in the order that registration and payments are received.** Therefore, we urge you to register as early as possible to avoid disappointment. **You will receive acknowledgment of registration.** Please call Customer Service at 240-567-5188 if Registration Confirmation is NOT received at least five days before the start of classes. Classrooms and specific locations will be stated on this acknowledgement. Courses may be canceled due to low enrollment.
5. All students must register prior to attending class; do not attend class if you have not registered in advance.
6. Pending funding, partial scholarships may be available for Montgomery County students who demonstrate financial need or qualify for free or reduced lunch. Call 240-567-7264 or 240-567-7917 for information.

## ***Residency Policy***

The following are general guidelines taken from the College policy on residency for tuition purposes. A copy of the policy is available in the Montgomery College Catalog.

- A. Students attending Montgomery College will pay tuition according to their residency.
- B. To qualify for tuition purposes as a resident of the state of Maryland, legal domicile must have been maintained for a period not less than three months prior to the first regularly scheduled class. Non-Maryland residents must pay out-of-state fees.
- C. The domicile of a person registering in a noncredit course at Montgomery College shall be considered as a person's permanent place of abode, where physical presence and possessions are maintained, and where he/she intends to remain indefinitely.
- D. Non-U.S. citizens must submit copy of passport visa or permanent resident card.
- E. Non-Maryland residents pay "Out-of-State" fees.

## ***Refund Policy***

1. Parents who wish to withdraw their child from a course will receive a 100 percent refund IF request is received at Montgomery College prior to the Refund Date listed on the course confirmation form.
2. **NO** refunds will be provided after the refund date posted on your confirmation form.
3.
