To Honor the Memory of Mr. John Diggs-Dorsey and Mr. Sidney Randolph, Lynched in Rockville, Maryland

Both men were dragged from the county jail by vigilante mobs. By reckoning with the truth of the racial violence that has shaped our communities, we seek to advance healing and reconciliation.

From the old county jail (now the County Council Building) past locations that were then central to the African-American community, to the sites where the men were lynched. Follows the approximate routes taken by the lynch mobs and then concludes at Welsh Park.
