Call to Order

Chair Tilandra Rhyne called the meeting to order at 1:00 p.m.

Constituent Concerns

- Our role: The Academic Services Council is to consider discussions on academic support
 programs including assessment centers, labs, registration, scheduling, website information,
 and transfer and articulation agreements, and forward suggestions to the College Council, the
 Senior Vice Presidents or other councils, as appropriate, for further consideration and/or
 action.
- Constituent Concerns
 - The ink.me printers across the college are not working. The Learning Center, the Writing Centers, and the Library staff have noticed this. Concerns have been submitted to Dr. Mills in March 2023, shared with Dr. Fechter in August 2023, and a group of Rockville students submitted a concern to Dr. Benjamin in Spring Semester 2023. Requests to have the printers fixed have not been honored.
 - The Examity live proctor testing takes away students' privacy rights. It makes the students nervous and creeped out. There is no Examity program for download onto Mac computers. Examity must be added as an extension to Chrome, which can time-out and cause the student get a red-flag on their exam.
 - CMSC 116 only has one section across all three campuses with one professor.

Dual Enrollment

- Dual enrollment is on the rise
- Middle College students complete at their high school or online
- Early College students meet on our college campuses for their last two years of high school
- Jumpstart students take a few classes during high school
- o Total dual enrollment increased 40% from Fall 2022 to Fall 2023
- o 248 sections in 27 disciplines
- Online/Remote/Z-course Offerings
 - 18,743 enrollment in online and remote courses (32% of total enrollment)
 - o 12,783 enrollment in Z-courses
 - 647 sections
 - 174 unique courses
 - 309 unique instructors
- Academic Support in Other Languages
 - o In the classroom
 - In the learning centers
 - In the libraries
- Academic Credit Schedule of Classes
 - Viewable for Fall, Winter, Spring
 - Students can plan courses for the entire academic year
 - Scheduling Committee has set a goal of having 80% of courses scheduled and staffed at the time it becomes viewable
- The printer service is under IT, which is under the Administrative and Fiscal Services Office, headed by Mr. Sherwin Collette

- FY 24 Classification and Compensation Study
 - FY24 Classification and Compensation Practices Study is underway. Phase I work is nearing completion, detailed information will be forthcoming. The next phase of the study will focus on faculty, staff, and administrators market assessments, pay structures, compensation practices, and related policies and procedures.
- MC Employee Insights: 2024 Fiscal Update
 - This update uncovers vital information on compensation adjustments, ESH rates, educational stipends, travel funds, essential training, and more.
- Flexible Work Arrangements Procedures and Guidelines Update
 - Three Key Changes/Revisions
 - Explicitly state that the number of permitted telework days for a regular telework schedule is up to two (2) days per week.
 - Current procedure (approved in June 2019) does not explicitly state the number of telework days.
 - Applies to regular (routine) telework schedules.
 - Supervisors still have discretion for flexibility, when needed.
 Procedures still allow for an additional or alternate "situational telework" day.
 - Voluntary remote work is still suspended. Only employees with an approved extended telework or term-based remote schedule as an ADA accommodation may regularly telework more than 2 days per week.
 - Remove the requirement that employees must complete their 6-month probationary period to be eligible to telework.
 - Hiring managers/supervisors have the discretion to determine when a new employee is eligible to telework based on the needs of the unit, the position's job duties, and the employee's readiness.
 - Administrators are required to submit FWA schedule for their unit/area three (3) times a year: August (Fall), January (Spring), and May (Summer).
 - The Unit/Area FWA Schedules form will confirm and document: 1)
 coverage for onsite services and operations, and 2) that all eligible
 employees taking advantage of flexible work options have the
 necessary agreement in place each semester/term.
 - The Unit/Area FWA Schedules form will be uploaded via a separate online submission form via the HRSTM website.
 - As with individual FWA agreements, Unit/Area FWA Schedules will be submitted to HRSTM for tracking only; HRSTM does not approve FWAs.

Office of Compliance, Risk, and Ethics Campus Climate Survey – Kristen Roe on behalf of Jasmine Ikard, Deputy Title IX Coordinator and Investigator

- MHEC Sexual Assault Climate Survey
- Since 2015, all higher education institutions have been required by Maryland law to report the result of a sexual assault biannual campus climate survey and submit an incident report log
- Survey Results indicate that MC students experience sexual assault at rates generally equivalent to the national average.
- Between 2018 2020, MC was able to expand awareness of resources available to students that experience sexual misconduct.
- Climate survey results are published on the SpeakUpMC website
- Beginning to promote survey in November, trying to get to 1000 responses
- Ideas on encouraging students to complete the survey
 - Offer extra credit for students
 - Include survey in an assignment

Constituency Concerns – Elysse Meredith

- Unfriendliness of automatic email sent to students upon registration for classes
 - o Email is sent from registrars@montgomerycollege.edu
 - o Concern will be referred to the Student Services and Success Council
- Communication issues between Academic Affairs and Student Affairs
 - o Confer with Dr. Fechter
- Potential inequitable compensation due to rank calculations for part-time faculty (alt-ESH assignments do not earn part-time faculty rank in the union for compensation)
 - This is not an Academic Services concern, nor a council issue
