## Call to Order

• The regular meeting was called to order at 1:00 pm by Chair Nghi Nguyen.

## **Constituent Concerns**

- EAP Deadlines
  - I would like to get clarity on EAP deadlines. I paid for professional memberships at the end of May and beginning of June. I was under the impression that these memberships could count towards my FY2023 EAP funds if they were submitted and approved by my manager by June 9th. The requests were sent back to me by EAP Requests and was told that I need to submit the spend requests after July 1st for FY24 because most of the membership is in FY24 and any membership request need to be submitted by April 15th. I checked the BOT Compensation Programs memo, EAP Requisitions, and the EAP Resource Guide. There are no April 15th deadline for membership in these documents.
  - Lynette Evans guided me to page 10 and 11 of the "BOT Compensation Programs" under the Financial Benefits section of the EAP section.
  - The costs associated with this benefit for study during regular summer school sessions will be charged to the budget of the fiscal year in which such summer school session ends.

 It talks about summer classes not memberships. I would like to clarify the cutoff date for a FY23 EAP request for memberships. Thank you so much for your help.

# • Gym Membership Fees

- The issue that I have is the reimbursement fees for outside gyms that have been capped at \$35 for so many years. I know you've been with college long enough to know that the \$35 has been the maximum amount for over 15 years. I have attached a list that shows the breakdown of gyms that offer MC discounts and those that do not. As you can see, most gyms are now charging at least \$40/month due to inflation and the effects of the Pandemic (makes sense, right?). If you can recall, the college used to reimburse employees the enrollment and monthly fees if they participated in 10 sessions per month, but at the moment, enrollment fees are no longer being reimbursed. It looks like the college is discouraging employees from participating in outside gyms, but not everyone can join the MC Wellness Program due to scheduling issues and unwillingness by some supervisors to let employees off for wellness sessions (I don't have a problem with my supervisor, but I bet there are employees who do). We have all been affected by the recession and the Pandemic and for me, paying an extra \$5 + enrollment fees is a lot of money. To be fair, I think it's time the college needs to increase the monthly membership to match what gyms are changing for basic membership and to continue reimbursing enrollment fees.
- Btw, I am aware that our insurance providers; Kaiser and Cigna offer some discounts and memberships in gyms, but the college needs to do more for us! (I have added the last statement because that is the response you will most likely get from HRSTM)
- Fyi—CoreLife (fitness and weight management program) is listed under Active & Fit Direct as accepting Kaiser insurance, but I contacted them today and they no longer accept it. You see, the list and options are getting shorter and shorter.
- Rockville Campus North Garage EV Charging Stations Issue
  - I was talking to a student earlier and in between conversation, she was mentioning that she was looking to charge her EV car. I told her about the North Garage, but she told me she couldn't find a spot. There are several charging stations that are broken. Not sure if you're the person to contact.
  - Could you look into this issue? I also charge my car in there sometimes and do notice four or five charging stations not working. Thanks.
