Dr Carolyn Terry, Associate Senior Vice President for Academic Affairs

- Happy Spring!
- Lumens Updates
 - Program managers, directors and program assistants are encouraged to attend an upcoming meeting on 4/21/2023 at the Gaithersburg Center about the full implementation of Lumens
 - Internal IT and Banner teams are working to integrate Lumens with Banner and other systems
 - The initial hope was a Fall 2023 launch which may not be feasible, but the intention is for a Spring 2024 launch at latest. This is Dr' Terry's main goal in her interim role.
 - This will allow WDCE to do many things that credit side has already

Rolando L. Santiago

Chief, Behavioral Health and Crisis Services Montgomery County Department of Health and Human Services

- Mr. Santiago Shared an overview of Behavioral Health and Crisis Services available for people of all ages in Montgomery County. Many of these services will be available for MC students and their families and communities.
- The mission of BHCS is to promote the behavioral health and wellbeing of Montgomery County residents.
 - BHCS is committed to providing culturally and linguistically competent care using evidence based best practices along a continuum of care.
 - Values dignity and respect, social justice, and partnerships with government agencies.

- BHCS is part of the Department of Health and Human Services. It was recently reaccredited and is currently in leadership transition
- BHCS strategic priorities include focus on harm reduction, crisis services, telehealth services, and behavioral health equity.
- BHCS has a large staff of 230+ working on a range of initiatives as well as partnering with external organizations to provide a variety of services:
 - Residential stabilization services, crisis intervention and outpatient treatment services
 - Medication assisted treatment and other substance use programs
 - Prevention, public awareness, harm reduction (Narcan kits and trainings, etc.)
 - Programs for incarcerated individuals during and after incarceration
 - Trauma services: victims of sexual assault; abused persons programs
 - Multilingual and multicultural services
 - External referrals
- The Crisis Now model is a behavioral health response to people experiencing a behavioral health crisis. This includes a call center, mobile crisis outreach (Independent civilian first response without police and use of peer support specialists in teams), a stabilization center, and crisis care follow up services.
 - Goal 1: divert people who need short-term stabilization from landing in jail or hospital emergency room
 - Goal 2: respond equitably
 - Goal 3: engage the community

Questions

- 1. Are the staff stretched thin? (Walter)
 - Response: There are vacancies for therapists because therapists are in very high demand now. They have never interrupted their 24/7 staffing, but came close a few times during the pandemic
- If a student in class has a behavioral health episode, what would be the first step for staff to take? (Dr. Terry)
 - Response: In case of crisis, (e.g. suicidal ideation), call the crisis center hotline: 240-777-4000 they can advise if it is appropriate to call campus security
 - Recommendation: Get Narcan kits for people in classroom settings given recent increase in fentanyl overdoses in the county
