

GRADUATION RATE SURVEY -- STUDENT RIGHT-TO-KNOW DISCLOSURE

In accordance with the Higher Education Act of 1965, and the Higher Education Opportunity Act of 2008, Montgomery College is reporting the graduation and transfer rates of students who entered the College in Fall 2012 as first-time, full-time, degree- or certificate-seeking students. The graduation and transfer rates are computed based on the student's status three years after entry (i.e., Fall 2012).

The data reflect that of the 2,068 students who entered as first-time, full-time, degree- or certificate-seeking students in Fall 2012, 17.9% had graduated and 24.7% had transferred to a baccalaureate postsecondary institution within three years, making the Montgomery College combined Graduation / Transfer rate 42.6% for the 2012 entering student cohort and the average Graduation / Transfer rate for the four years 2009, 2010, 2011, and 2012 was 40.3%.

FALL - TO - FALL RETENTION RATES -- STUDENT RIGHT-TO-KNOW DISCLOSURE

In accordance with the Higher Education Act of 1965, and the Higher Education Opportunity Act of 2008, Montgomery College is reporting the fall-to-fall retention (return) rates for new full-time and new part-time students. These data represent the percentage of students who entered in Fall 2012, or 2013, or 2014 who returned the following fall semester (i.e., Fall 2013, 2014, or 2015). The return rate for full-time students for the most recent Fall-to-Fall timeframe was 77%, and for students beginning on a part-time basis was 57%.
