Montgomery College currently offers 17 online degrees and 12 online certificates, with another five fully online programs pending approval from the Maryland Higher Education Commission. The College has seen tremendous growth in fully asynchronous online courses, and in recent years has also seen growth in synchronous structured remote courses. Open educational resources, zero cost textbooks, and extended winter enrollments also contribute to the College's overall online enrollments.

To better serve student needs, the graphic design discipline is prepared to offer a fully online delivery option for the general graphic design associate of applied science. Providing a fully online option for program completion offers working professionals a pathway to degree completion, and it helps family caregivers and full-time workers balance their personal and professional responsibilities while earning their degree in an online format. A fully online delivery option also allows the discipline to advertise the online program to attract more students.

The outstanding quality of a Montgomery College education remains the same for programs with a fully online option. The College's online programs follow the same curriculum at the same cost as the on-campus options. All online programs are taught by the same expert faculty who teach on-campus, all of whom are trained and certified in online quality assurance. Students have online access to the College's same exceptional student support services. The online delivery option will use the same institutional resources as the on-campus delivery option. Furthermore, Montgomery College's Office of Assessment conducts an academic program review every three years to ensure the program curriculum and student learning outcomes are coherent, cohesive, and comparable, regardless of program modality.

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Board of Trustees approve the addition of a fully online delivery option for the general graphic design area of concentration, graphic design associate of applied science and that the president be authorized to submit an application for approval to the Maryland Higher Education Commission.

THE PROPOSED FY25 CAPITAL BUDGET

BACKGROUND

The proposed FY25 capital budget and six-year FY25–30 capital improvement program was presented and discussed at the October 16, 2023, Board of Trustees meeting. The capital improvement program is supported by and implements the College's Facilities Master Plan. The request for FY25 is the second half of the FY25–30 biennial capital budget and totals \$48,869,000. A copy of the proposed capital budget was distributed to the board at its October meeting. No changes to the budget were requested by the board. The board's adoption of the proposed FY25 capital budget is necessary for the county executive's consideration of these requests in the county's capital improvement program. Attached is a summary table that shows the proposed FY25 request by project, along with the FY26 request for each project.

It is recommended that the Board of Trustees adopt the FY25 capital budget, which requests a total of \$48,869,000 and authorize the transmittal of the budget to the county.
