Speaking of student success, I want to thank the Montgomery College Chapter of the American Association of University Professors (AAUP) for voting to reallocate their FY20 Educational Assistance Program (EAP) funds to emergency student support. The \$150,000 that was made available is helping students with critical needs, as the pandemic continues to interfere with employment and strain families. The funds are being distributed to students in need for tuition, fees, supplies, and technology. This decision by AAUP manifests its already deep commitment to student success.

Also helping students and families in need in our area have been multiple food drives hosted on our campuses over the last ten days. They have drawn more than 1,000 people, showing how much need there continues to be. I am grateful to everyone who continues to think of student success in holistic terms.
