Faculty and Staff Successes

Two MC employees have been selected by the <u>Hispanic Association of Colleges and Universities</u> to join 54 others nationwide in the inaugural cohort of *Enlace*, a new leadership program. Yanira L. Rodriguez, community engagement manager, and Dr. Glenda Hernandez Tittle, professor of education, will engage in a six-month leadership development program designed to increase Latino/Latina leadership at Hispanic Serving Institutions. We're so proud of their selection! Another point of pride is that the College has been named a FamilyU Seal recipient for 2023–2026 by <u>Generation Hope</u>. The seal is awarded to higher education institutions and nonprofit organizations making significant strides towards serving parenting students. As one of 13 institutions chosen from a competitive field, MC was also selected as the group's Exemplar institution. The designation means MC will receive \$25,000 to continue advancing our student-parent work. I'm so pleased that MC is building continuously on its support for student-parents.
