As the College works to connect more K-12 students with our offerings, I would like to share information about a couple of recent events. The <u>Maryland Science Olympiad</u> held recently on the Germantown Campus brought hundreds of students and their families to our facilities. More than 400 high school students representing 20 area high schools competed in fields like biology, chemistry,

physics, space, and earth sciences, demonstrating their advanced skills. On Saturday, the Boy Scouts of America brought almost 200 students—of all genders—to the Rockville Campus for events supported by 45 MC faculty and staff volunteers. The Scouts earned merit badges in topics like archaeology, fire safety, and public health. It was a wonderful event, and I was impressed by our employees' encouragement of these students.
