## **Reading and English Flowchart**

Reading and English courses fall into three categories: continuing education, developmental, and college-level.

Note: Starting fall 2014, the College will transition to new course names and numbers. New course numbers listed in bold. Previous course numbers are listed in (parenthesis).

Note: Courses with arrows must be taken in the order shown.

Based on placement test scores, students may not need to take all courses as listed. Developmental reading courses should be taken first.
