Dr. Intondi was also asked to be a contributor to a documentary to air on PBS about the role of African Americans in the nuclear age. In addition, he was a featured speaker at an event hosted by the Stanley Center and WCAPS, "Racism and the Origins of the Atomic Bomb" on February 23rd and will speak on the intersection of race and nuclear weapons at the Institut Barcelona d'Estudis Internacionals (IBEI) May 17th. He has been formally invited to attend the First States Parties for the Treaty on the Prohibition of Nuclear Weapons at the UN in Vienna this summer as a delegate for civil society and by invitation spoke at Harvard on December 10th with a group of experts on arms control, deterrence, and disarmament for new project at the Belfer Center.

Dr. Intondi was interviewed by the NY Times for an article that will be out in the coming weeks examining the role of African Americans and the Manhattan Project. In addition, he signed a contract with Cambridge University Press to write a chapter on race and nuclear weapons for their multivolume series on nuclear studies Finally, he signed a contract with Johns Hopkins University Press for a new book that examines the antinuclear movement in the 1980s, specifically the June 12, 1982 rally in Central Park.
