NURS 121- Basic Health Assessment

Course Description

NURS 121: Basic Health Assessment Provides instruction and guided practice in the assessment techniques used to gather subjective and objective data from patients in a health care setting and the documentation of that data. Assessment of all body systems covered. **PREREQUISITE(S):** Admission to the nursing program or consent of the program coordinator. **PRE-or COREQUISITE(S):** A grade of C or better in **BIOL 150**. Three hours laboratory each week.

Course Outcomes

Upon completion of this course, a student will be able to:

- 1. Recognize the importance of health assessment through the application of the Five dimensions of man, Maslow's theory and/or Erikson growth and developmental stages in patient care.
- 2. Utilize professional, collaborative, and therapeutic communication skills during the health assessment process.
- 3. Apply the nursing process to each health assessment.
- 4. Discuss the legal and ethical considerations of a health assessment.
- 5. Identify normal versus abnormal assessment findings.
- 6. Demonstrate mastery of documentation and documentation tools.
- 7. Complete a Health History.
- 8. Demonstrate mastery of health assessment techniques.

Process for Determining Grade

Assignments: 30 points

- **a. Pre-class Reading Assignment (8 points).** Students are required to complete Pre-class Reading Assignments for assessment topic/s of the week before each class.
- **b. Weekly Focused Health Assessment (12 points).** Students will be evaluated weekly on assessment skills learned each week using the Weekly Focused Assessment Checklist.

- **c. ATI Skills Module (3 points).** Students will complete 3 learning modules on physical assessment in ATI. Students will submit proof of completion of 100% on post-test on designated due dates.
- d. Health Assessment Projects (7 points). Students will complete 3 projects.

2. Physical Assessment Exams: 70 points

- a. OSCE 1 Comprehensive Health Assessment (40 points). Students will complete a comprehensive health assessment on a classmate and document findings in DocuCare.
- **b. OSCE 2 Bedside Assessment (30 points).** Students will perform a Bedside Shift Assessment and report findings/data using ISBARR.
