**Charlaine Prescott** has performed across the United States and Canada, including several solo performances at the John F. Kennedy Center, with the Northwestern University Symphony Orchestra, the Reston Chamber Symphony, the Barry Studio Orchestra, and the West Potomac Sinfonietta. Ms. Prescott has been principal cellist of orchestras at the Tanglewood Music Center, Music Academy of the West, and the Manhattan School of Music. She is a member of the United States Marine Chamber Orchestra.

She received her undergraduate education at Northwestern University, having studied with Hans Jensen, in 2009, and her master's degree from the Manhattan School of Music in 2011.

**Mark Eisenhower** is a graduate of Col. Zadok Magruder High School and has been the instrumental music teacher there since 1985. The Magruder bands and orchestras regularly earn Superior ratings at district and state festivals. His Bachelor of Music Education is from the University of Northern Colorado and he taught for three years in Mitchell, Nebraska, before returning to Montgomery County. An active bass trombonist, Mr. Eisenhower has performed with the Capitol Wind Symphony, Trinity Chamber Orchestra, and the Maryland Band Directors Band. He has conducted several Montgomery County Public Schools honors ensembles, including the junior and senior honor bands. For the past several years, he has prepared the Senior Honor Band before the arrival of out-of-state guest conductors. He has conducted the Anne Arundel County Mid-Level Honor Band and the Calvert County Honor Band. He served as the manager of the Maryland Senior All-State Band for fourteen years, and in 2001 Mr. Eisenhower had the honor of conducting the Maryland Junior All-State Band.

**Michael Mogensen** is a composer, arranger, conductor, and French horn player who is a native and resident of Hagerstown, Maryland. Born in 1973, he is an alumnus of the music schools of James Madison University and Ithaca College. Mr. Mogensen's compositions for band and orchestra are published through the C. L. Barnhouse Company and the TRN Music Company. He has held positions with Warner Brothers Publications and Disney Music Publishing and has served as an adjudicator, clinician, instructor and guest-conductor for many high school and college level events.

Mr. Mogensen's works have been presented throughout the world, including performances at the esteemed Music Center at Strathmore, the John F. Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts, and the Midwest International Band and Orchestra Clinic. He has been honored with multiple ASCAP Concert Music Awards as well as the prestigious Colonel Arnauld D. Gabriel Composition Prize given by The United States Air Force Band in Washington, D.C. His commissioned work, *Aerial Fantasy*, received a 2007 Pulitzer Prize nomination. Mr. Mogensen was also the recipient of a Masterworks Prize for living composers, granted by ERMMedia. His award-winning orchestral composition, *Chapter Fina* will appear on Volume 17 of the CD Series *Masterworks of the New Era*. Mr. Mogensen is one of the featured composers in volume four of the book series, *Composers on Composing for Band*, published by GIA Publications, Inc.

**Vincent Patterson** is the founder and Director of the Maryland Band Directors Band. His Doctor of Musical Arts in conducting is from Catholic University, and his degrees in instrumental performance and music education are from Millikin University. In the U.S. Army, he taught at the Armed Forces School of Music in Norfolk, after which he was accepted into the U.S. Marine Band, *The President's Own*. He has sung with the Washington National Opera Chorus, has been a member of the Choir of Men and Boys at Washington National Cathedral, and the choirs of The National Shrine, St. Paul's Church, and St. Matthew's Cathedral. From 1995 to 2010, he was the conductor of the Rockville Concert Band, for which the City of Rockville gave him its Lifetime Achievement in the Arts award in 2007.
