Kristi Licare teaches instrumental music at Westland and Pyle middle schools in Montgomery County. A native of New York, she is a 2014 graduate of the University of Maryland where she earned both the Bachelor of Music Education in K-12 education and the Master of Music in clarinet performance, studying with David Jones. While still in high school she was enrolled in the Julliard School of Music's pre-college division where she studied with Laura Flax.

At UMD, Ms. Licare was the president of the student chapter of the National Association for Music Education in both her junior and senior years. This is her second year in the Maryland Band Directors Band.

Michael A. Mogensen is the Maryland Band Directors Band's Composer-in-Residence. A Hagerstown-based composer, arranger, conductor, and French horn player, he is a graduate of James Madison University and Ithaca College. His compositions for band and orchestra are published by C. L. Barnhouse and TRN Music. Mr. Mogensen has held positions with Warner Brothers Publications and Disney Music Publishing and he has served as an adjudicator, clinician, instructor, and guest conductor for many high school and college level events.

Mr. Mogensen's works have been presented throughout the world, including at the esteemed Music Center at Strathmore, the John F. Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts, and the Midwest International Band and Orchestra Clinic. He has been honored with multiple ASCAP Concert Music Awards and the prestigious Colonel Arnald D. Gabriel Composition Prize given by The United States Air Force Band. His commissioned work, *Aerial Fantasy*, received a 2007 Pulitzer Prize nomination. Mr. Mogensen has received ERM Media's Masterworks Prize for living composers, and his award-winning orchestral composition, *Chapter Final*, will appear on the CD series *Masterworks of the New Era*. Mr. Mogensen is one of the featured composers in volume four of the book series, *Composers on Composing for Band*, published by GIA Publications, Inc.

Rick Penix is the Coordinator of Fine Arts for the Montgomery County Public Schools. He oversees the instrumental music curriculum and program for grades 4 through 12 and coordinates honors bands and orchestras and the district band and orchestra festivals.

Mr. Penix was previously the Fine Arts Teacher Specialist in Calvert County where he was responsible for music, visual art, and dance. As a music teacher in Calvert County, he directed bands and choruses that received excellent and superior ratings at district and state festivals.

Mr. Penix received his music education degree from Marshall University and his master's degree in administration from McDaniel College. He has served as the Southern Region President of the Maryland Music Educators Association and he adjudicates across the state, including at the Maryland State Solo and Ensemble Festival. Mr. Penix has been interim conductor of the Rockville and Olney community concert bands and is the choir director at Huntingtown United Methodist Church. Mr. Penix lives in Prince Frederick, Maryland, with his wife and two children.



Vincent Patterson is the Founding Director of the Maryland Band Directors Band. His Doctor of Musical Arts in conducting is from Catholic University, and his degrees in instrumental performance and music education are from Millikin University. In the U.S. Army, he taught at the Armed Forces School of Music in Norfolk, after which he was accepted into the U.S. Marine Band, *The President's Own*, in Washington, D.C. He has sung with the Washington National Opera Chorus, the Choir of Men and Boys at Washington National Cathedral, and the choirs of The National Shrine, St. Paul's Church, and St. Matthew's Cathedral. From 1995 to 2010, he was the conductor of the Rockville Concert Band, for which the City of Rockville gave him its Lifetime Achievement in the Arts award in 2007.

The **Maryland Band Directors Band** is one-of-a-kind in that it comprises almost entirely professional music educators. Concerts are prepared in merely three two-hour rehearsals, requiring the performers to be excellent sight readers and well prepared for every rehearsal. Members register as continuing education learners at Montgomery College and earn 1.5 continuing education units applicable to Maryland state recertification requirements for those with the Advanced Placement Certificate.

MBDB was created in 2011 by Dr. Vincent Patterson, teachers from the Montgomery County Public Schools, and the Montgomery College Arts Institute, in conjunction with Montgomery County Public Schools administrators. In 2013, it performed at the Maryland Music Educators Association Conference in Baltimore. Members come from Montgomery, Howard, Washington, and Prince George's counties and the District of Columbia and Virginia. Several members were previously in the premier Army, Air Force, Navy, and Marine bands in Washington, D.C.
