START HERE: Digital Fundamentals for Teaching & Learning (DFTL)

The foundation for all online teaching at MC. You'll learn: Blackboard navigation & course setup, digital communication tools, online assessments & Grade Center, multimedia creation.

Format & Requirements

Approximately 4-week online training. Required for all faculty teaching online. Building instructor presence and digital skills.



THEN ADVANCE TO: Online Teaching Training (OT)

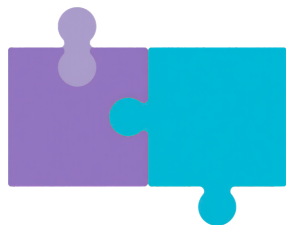
Design and facilitate high-quality online courses. You'll learn: Online pedagogy & facilitation; designing inclusive, engaging online courses.

OT Course Details

Applying Quality Matters (QM) standards, creating effective learning activities, understanding L.E.C.T. competencies. 7-week structured course.



HOW THEY FIT TOGETHER



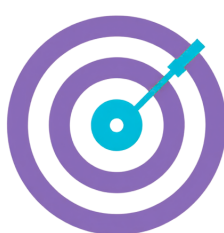
DFTL = Skills to operate online. OT = Skills to teach and design online. DFTL gives you the tools, OT teaches you how to build the course.

WHO NEEDS WHAT?

All faculty teaching online → Must complete DFTL + OT

Experienced online faculty → May request credit for prior learning (Prior Learning Assessment) for OT (with approval)

Faculty Teaching Common Courses → Must complete DFTL

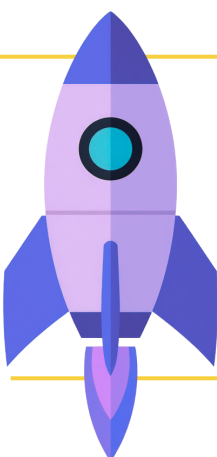


THE BOTTOM LINE
