### **ACCOUNTING CAREER PATHWAY – Government Agency or Regulatory Accounting**

This pathway involves maintaining the accounting records of public entities at the federal, state, county, and city levels, or enforcing regulatory compliance. Agencies and regulators have an obligation to manage and budget sources of public revenue and ensure that funds are used appropriately and responsibly. While accounting practices are similar, there are additional layers specific to government accountability and compliance. Most notable: IRS, SEC, State Taxing Authorities, and the Social Security Administration.
