Nursing Program Plan at MC

The nursing program is a full time – two year commitment (no deviation from format)
The nursing program is an Associate of Science Degree in Nursing (ADN graduate)
An exam National Council Licensure Examination (NCLEX) is required upon completion of the program, to obtain RN status

The Nursing Program

- High demands (academics and time)
- Med Math proficiency is tested in EVERY semester
- English proficiency (verbal and written) is a skill needed in EVERY nursing course
- Basic Computer skills are required

Articulation & Dual Enrollment Processes

Montgomery College has a dual enrollment process with UMSON. You are able to apply when attending MC (must meet their admission criteria GPA of 3.0 and in science courses GPA of 2.75). You complete the ADN program, pass the NCLEX and continue on to obtain your BSN. MC has articulation agreements for other RN to BSN programs, list on the College web site.

- Go to Montgomery College web site Raptor Central for all steps for the admission process. Phone: 240 567 5000 & Email: raptor.central@montgomerycollege.edu
- May enroll on-line and pay the admission fee
- Prior degree or college credits, have official transcript sent to the Office of Registration & Records (TP/SS campus)
- International transcript must be evaluated by an external vendor (WES or Josef Silny & Associates)
- Meet with a counselor to discuss transcript and establish academic plan; check Starfish for available appointments

Nursing Application Requirements

- ENGL 102 or 103
- BIOL 212
 - Please note: BIOL 150 is a nursing program requirement
- MATH 117 or higher (MATH 120)
- Completion of **priority course** strongly encouraged (BIOL 213)
- GPA of 2.5 or higher
- Minimum scores: TEAS ATI Version 6
 - Reading 70%
 - AITS (Total Score) 66%

Applying to the Nursing Program

- You can access the application from the Montgomery College - Health Sciences web site; print & please make sure it is legible with full address information
- April 1 is for fall semester and August 1 is for spring semester; RN Transition (LPN/Military Medic/EMT students have application date of 3/1
- Fall & spring admissions @ 128 and summer @ 32
- Selection for admission is based on a "Point System"

Nursing Admission Point System

Selection for admissions is based on a Point system. Students who completed the priority course(s) and have the highest total points will be admitted first until all seats are filled.

- TEAS (Reading-70%, AITS-66%)
- Exemplary 4 pts
- Advance 3 pts
- Proficient 2 pts
- GPA (based on science courses)
- 4.00 4 pts
- 3.50 to 3.99 3 pts
- 3.00 to 3.49 2 pts
- 2.50 to 2.99 1 pts
- Priority Courses Completed
- All 4 pts
- None 0 pts
- Number of attempts to pass minimum requirements and priority courses
- 1st attempt 4 pts
- 2nd attempt 3 pts
- 3rd attempt 2 pts
- 4th attempt 1 pts
- Prior Educational Experience
- Prior degree 3 pts
- 6 8 credit hours/semester 2 pts
- 3 5 credit hours/semester 1 pts
- (credit hours are based on last 24 credits)

Once Admitted to the Nursing Program

- You will receive a letter offering admission to the Nursing Program from the Enrollment Services (time sequence for fall & spring)
- READ and FOLLOW DIRECTIONS
- An acceptance response must be submitted to the Office of Registration & Records
- Incoming students must attend the mandatory Orientation/Registration meetings

Documents Required Prior to Admission

- Health insurance is required for all students
- Health Records: multiple documents are required.
 More specific information will be provided in the Admission Letter
- CPR: American Heart Association BLS/ Provider only
- Criminal background check & Drug/Alcohol testing is required

Failure to submit all required documents prior to the due date will result in removal from admission list.
