**UNIVERSITY OF MARYLAND, COLLEGE PARK NOTES**

^^Courses listed as having “no exact UMCP course equivalent” still transfer toward the total number of credits required for a University of Maryland bachelor’s degree. UMCP degree requirements include major requirements, General Education requirements, and elective coursework totaling 120 credits for this program.

\*If students complete four approved World Language courses at Montgomery College (MC), they will have completed UMCP’s College of Arts & Humanities Global Engagement Requirement and 75% of the Global Culture and Thought major’s Language Study requirement. Students will complete the final 25%(one World Languages course) upon transfer to UMCP.

\*\* HIST114, HIST116, and HIST117 do not have specific UMCP course equivalencies, but each count as a 3-credit UMCP General Education Distributive Studies Humanities requirement.

\*\*\* MC students must select from approved MC General Education category course options; UMCP equivalency may vary (consult UMCP transfer credit database, <https://registrar.umd.edu/transfer-credit/transfer-course-database>), but will at minimum count toward the total required for the UMCP degree.
