

Drawing on decades of work in prisons, war zones, refugee shelters, and the concert stage, Dr. André de Quadros makes a case for dreaming big and connecting the arts in the struggle for a better world.

Dr. Quadros is a Latino Asian educator, ethnomusicologist, and human rights activist, with professional work in more than 40 countries, spanning professional ensembles, projects in prisons, psychosocial rehabilitation, refugees, poverty locations, and victims of torture, sexual violence, and trauma.

In 2019, he was a Distinguished Academic Visitor at the University of Cambridge. Among his publications are the 2019 monograph, Focus: Choral Music in Global Perspective (Routledge), a 2020 co-edited book, My Body was Left on the Street: Music Education and Displacement (Brill), and a 2021 co-authored book, Poking the WASP Nest: Young People, Applied Theatre, and Education about Race (Brill).
