

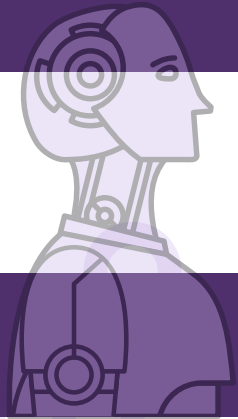

Teaching Consecutive Interpretation to Technologically Immersed Students

Exploring interdisciplinary approaches in teaching consecutive interpretation to technologically absorbed students. This presentation focuses on how to offset technology's impact on Short Term Memory and improve the communicative aspect of consecutive interpretation.
