Additionally, the Student Voter Action Plan highlights a policy excusing students from class to vote; requiring a public and private nonprofit institutions of higher education to make the student voting plan available to the public and provide the plan to the Maryland Higher Education Commission. 7. Executive Summary

Please summarize your institution's approach to Student Voter Action and Engagement.

Montgomery College coordinates its student voter action and engagement efforts through the MC Votes committee. The Office of Community Engagement convenes monthly meetings of the MC Votes committee. This committee is led by a representative from Student Affairs (Lisa Hackley, student life director for the Rockville Campus), Academic Affairs (professor Joe Stumpf, chair of the History and Political Science Department), and the Office of Community Engagement (Karla Silvestre, director). Our student voting coordinator has been Gloria Bonilla, associate director for community engagement though she retired in August of 2024. An acting coordinator, Katie Nguyen, has been named until a new staff is hired to assume this role in January of 2025. Ms. Bonilla also coordinated our MC Student Ambassador Program for peer-to-peer engagement with students. The monthly meetings are used to plan activities for the year, advocate for voter empowerment improvements at the College, learn about and promote different departments' efforts in voter engagement, and coordinate efforts. We used our data from the National Study of Learning, Voting, and Engagement to guide our work. Our data from 2018 and 2022 told us that many of our students were registered to vote and voter registration rates remained consistent (70.2% and 73.6% respectively). However, the percent of registered students actually voting on election day (voting rate) had declined by 16.2%. Since then, we targeted some of our activities to get out the vote during early voting and on election day.

We partner each year with the League of Women Voters for Montgomery County, the Montgomery County Board of Elections, and local sororities and fraternities. These groups regularly conduct outreach activities on campus to encourage students to register to vote, check their registration, and sign up to become election workers. A few years ago, the League of Women Voters conducted a study on student voting and best practices which we have used to guide our work. They recommended in-person outreach, peer-to-peer contact, use of social media to have students challenge their networks to use social media to get out the vote, and to help students know what to expect when they get to the voting booth. We tried to direct our activities to meet some of these best practices by conducting tabling on all three campuses, recruiting six MC Votes student ambassadors, passing out voter guides so students could study the candidates, hosting faculty-led events, and implementing a robust communications plan including social media.

One of our unique strategies is the MC Votes Student Ambassador program. These are students (some paid as student workers and some volunteer) who work to promote voter engagement on campus. They conduct outreach on each campus passing out information on voter registration, poll worker opportunities, and other information such as polling locations. They work with faculty so they can speak to their classes and engage with their peers directly. They also produce videos encouraging students to register, vote on election day, and encourage others to vote. We have found the MC Votes Student Ambassador program to be an effective strategy to encourage student voter participation.

Faculty at Montgomery College are emailed a document with important election dates to bring up with their students and are referred to the MC Votes website to find other resources such as Montgomery College library's voter resource guide so they can integrate voter education in their classes. Other faculty invite local elected officials to their classes to discuss several topics of importance to students, civic education, elections, and current events. The faculty representative of our MC Votes committee presented to all faculty chairs on several occasions about the resources available to them on voting so they could plan to integrate lessons into the courses for the spring and fall semesters.

The Office of Student Life holds numerous events throughout the year to engage students in voting and civic education (see list of events below). For example, on National Voter Registration Day and National Vote Early Day, they hosted the League of Women Voters to conduct in-person outreach on each of our campuses and organized fun trivia activities to connect with students around voting.

The Office of Compliance, Risk, and Ethics sends out a reminder to all students on how they can register to vote several times a year. The communication is visually appealing and contains both College, county, and state resources.

In addition, the Office of Communications and the Office of Community Engagement promote voting information through newsletters, social media, and videos in multiple languages.

This past academic year we had increased capacity to do outreach to students through a Maryland Service Corps member, Shannon Roundtree. He helped with outreach to students on voter education from September 2023-August 2024. He was on campus each week giving out information about voting to students and he held several events on campus related to voting. This greatly increased our capacity to outreach to students this year.

For the first time this year, we had ballot boxes on each campus provided by the Maryland State Board of Elections. Much of our promotions this year were focused on raising awareness to students, faculty, staff, and the community on the availability of the ballot boxes so they could use them thereby increasing voting access on campus.

Montgomery College was recognized on the 2024 Most Engaged Campuses for College Student Voting. ALL IN's Most Engaged Campuses for College Student Voting recognizes colleges and universities making intentional efforts to increase nonpartisan democratic engagement and college student voting. We continued to celebrate National Voter Registration Day. We maintained our participation in the ALL IN Campus Democracy Challenge by submitting a nonpartisan democratic engagement action plan. We also submitted the Higher Education President's Commitment to Full Student Voter Participation through which Dr. Jermaine F. Williams, president of Montgomery College, commits to striving towards full student voter participation and making a statement to show commitment to student voter engagement.

Montgomery College earned a Bronze Seal from the ALL IN Campus Democracy Challenge based on our 2022 campus voting rate from your National Study of Learning, Voting, and Engagement (NSLVE) report from Tufts University.

This year we applied for the Community College Concert Competition but we were not selected for this national prize. Regardless, the organizers shared print and electronic resources with all the colleges that applied.

Student Voter Engagement Partners

The traditional way of organizing student voter engagement through partnerships was challenged during the pandemic and colleges and universities had to creatively re-think how to engage with their student population.

19. Who are your campus community student voter engagement partners? The partners can include both internal and external groups working to promote voter outreach and education on campus.

We partner with the League of Women Voters for Montgomery County, the Montgomery County Board of Elections, and local sororities and fraternities every year. These groups regularly conduct outreach activities on our three campuses to encourage students to register to vote, check their registration, and sign up to become election workers. We also work with the Civic Circle, a non-profit organization that works to promote civic education in elementary schools, by recruiting MC students to volunteer and conduct

presentations in elementary schools. New this year, we partnered with the Arts and Humanities Council of Montgomery County to host a banner competition called Promote the Vote for our students and alumni. A recent graduate was selected, and her design was displayed on each of our campuses in multiple locations. Our internal partners include Student Life, Academic Affairs, Community Engagement, Montgomery College Television, Office of Communications, Montgomery College Libraries, and the Alumni Relations office.

Student Voter and Civic Engagement Goals

Civic engagement involves working to make a difference in the civic life of one's community and developing the combination of knowledge, skills, values, and motivation to make that difference. Because students are so diverse, as are the contexts in which they participate and the issues they face, civic engagement will mean different things to different groups of young people.


Goals

Per our strategic plan, we strive to enhance connections between Montgomery College and our community. One of our intended outcomes is the integration of civic engagement in the College's practices. Ultimately, we strive to see increases in our student voter participation rates. Currently, the strategic plan outcomes group is assessing the following.

1. Which general education classes are integrating civic engagement and what are they doing to accomplish this?
2. Which classes integrate service learning through extra credit or as a part of the syllabus?
3. How much student volunteering is tracked through our service-learning database?
4. How many events on campus are held each year to directly related to deliberate dialogue and civic engagement skills?

The MC Votes committee's goals are to raise awareness about upcoming elections, promote the ballot drop boxes on campus, promote voter registration or updating their registration, and pledging to vote on election day.

Voting, Registration and Yield Rates



In 2022, our student voter registration rate was 73.6% and 24.8% of registered credit students voted. Therefore, our overall voting rate was 24.8% (eligible students who voted). This is a decline from the last mid-term election in 2018.

First Year Student Voter Participation

Our efforts are geared to all community college students (credit and noncredit) without regard to their length of time at Montgomery College. Our students represent a mix of students, some of whom transfer in with credits and workforce development students. Focusing on just first year students would miss these populations.
