#### **Parking**

- You MUST have a permit to park on any campus.
- Parking permits are valid on all 3 campuses.
- Parking is not guaranteed.
- Purchase through <u>MyMC</u>
- Place hangtag on rearview mirror
- One hangtag per employee
- Ticketed? Pay or appeal
  - 10 days to file appeal from ticket date



#### Access to Buildings & Rooms

- Key/Card requests are processed through Campus Facilities Help Desk.
- Keep your swipe cards secured!
- Contact Facilities Help Desk or locksmith
  - Card does not work
  - Add rooms
  - Replace damaged card
- Contact Public Safety if you don't have a key/card yet or if you lost yours
  - Allow time for us to arrive
  - Beginning of the semester brings lots of calls
- Holiday/Closures? No access unless pre-approved.
   Dean/Department Chair sends request to Campus Facilities Director who notifies Public Safety if approved.

## College Closings or Delays

- Watch TV, listen to radio
- Check your e-mail, voice mail
- Register for Montgomery College Alerts through MyMC
  - Allows for text, email, and/or phone notifications in case of closing or other urgent/emergency notifications.



#### Medical Emergencies

- Call 9-1-1 first, if life-threatening emergency
- Call Campus Public Safety
- AEDs available in Campus Buildings



#### Employee Injuries on the Job

- Call Public Safety when an accident or illness occurs on the job.
- Emergency Medical Service transport is highly suggested for a serious injury/illness on campus.
- Complete Worker's Compensation Packet.
- Notify Supervisor.
- Refer to Human Resources



#### Minimize Injuries

- Call Campus Facilities Help Desk for hazards
  - Slippery floors
  - Broken doors/furniture
  - Burned out lights
  - Water leaks

#### **Preventing Crimes**

- Do not leave your belongings unattended, not even for a second.
- Maintain control of assigned keys and cards.
- Keep office and car doors locked.
- Keep valuables (purse) out of sight/secured.
- Park in well lighted areas, especially when leaving at night

#### **Preventing Crime on Campus**

- If on campus late or after dark, travel with a group.
- If doors are locked when leaving, make sure they shut completely
- Public Safety provides an escort to and from vehicles.
- Emergency phones—direct line to Public Safety



#### Reporting A Crime

- Go to a safe location, call Public
- Do NOT put yourself in harm's way
- Do NOT try to apprehend the "suspect"
- Do NOT keep an incident to yourself.
- Do NOT be a detective.
- Do NOT force a victim to report a crime, unless required by Clery or Title IX.

#### Disruptive Individuals

- Attempt to de-escalate the situation rather than ignore or return hostile feelings
- Remain calm and be patient
- Listen and avoid arguments
- Offer solutions that may relieve stressors the person is experiencing
- Take a class break
- If you can't de-escalate the situation, call Public Safety!
- Students with Behaviors of Concern
   bizarre thoughts, serious depression, excessive anxiety or
   inappropriate display of emotions

#### **Complete a BIT Report**

#### In Case of Emergency

- ✓ Immediate Threat/Danger Call 911
  - 1. Fire
  - 2. Active Shooter
  - 3. Hazardous Material Spill
- ✓ Walk quickly to nearest available exit
- ✓ Call Public Safety
- ✓ Follow Emergency Procedures posted in classroom
- ✓ If Mass Notification System activated, listen and look for instructions

#### What does Title IX prohibit?

It prohibits sex discrimination in educational institutions, programs and activities. This includes:

- Sexual assault and other forms of sexual violence
- Domestic, intimate partner and dating violence
- Stalking
- Hostile work environment
- Sexual harassment (quid pro quo, disparate treatment)
- Failing to provide appropriate accommodations for a pregnant or parenting student
- Treating a person different based on marital status
- Sexual misconduct

#### RAPTOR SEARCH

#### What is Course Reserves?

The MC Libraries Course Reserves service allows faculty to make course-related materials available to students, either electronically or at one of the campus library service desks. Physical materials may be borrowed for up to two hours at a time for in-library use, while electronic reserves are available 24-7 online. Items that may be on reserve for a class include: books, journal articles, textbooks, videos, book chapters, and audio recordings.





#### THINGS TO NOTE

- The Libraries (except Cafritz) are open until 10 PM Monday-Thursday!
- There are no photocopiers available. We strongly encourage students using the Libraries to bring a USB "flash" drive with them.
- Students log into the computers by their M# and last name. The sessions are for 2 hour blocks of time, for a maximum time of 6 hours per day.
- Printing on campus is 10 cents a page and must be paid by credit card or WEPA card, available for purchase in the bookstore.




