Librarian Liaison Teams & Library Locations

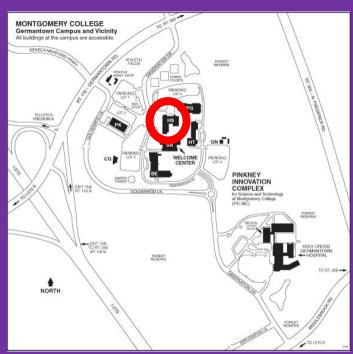
Four Discipline Liaison Librarian Teams

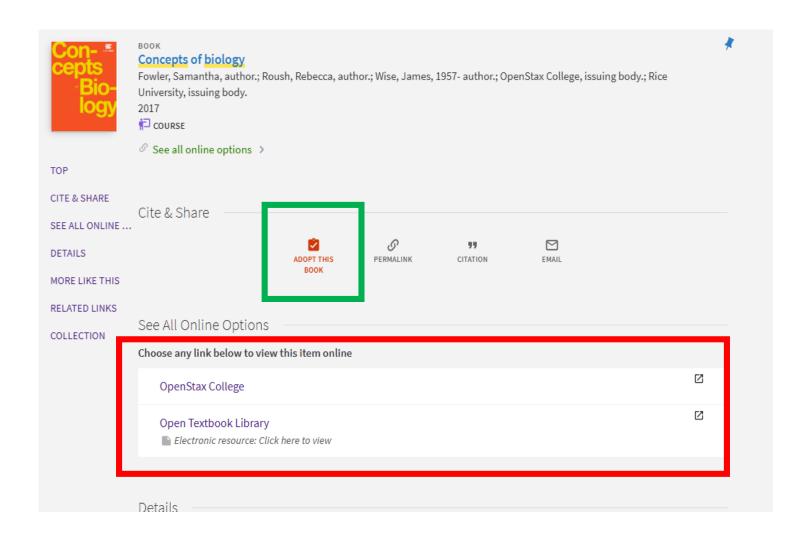
- Platform for faculty to locate and adopt ebooks or e-textbooks. The platform offers thousands of titles across academic subjects.

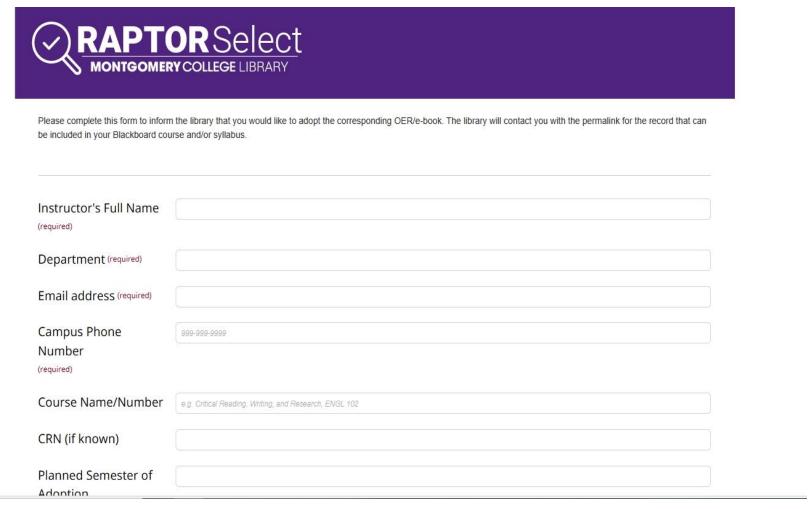

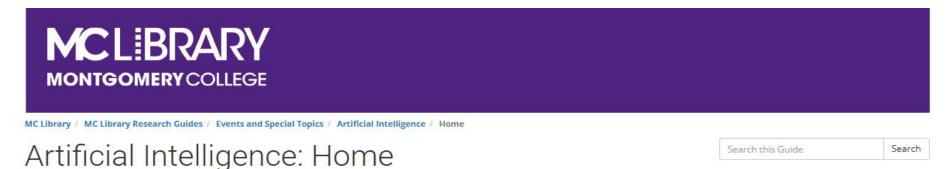

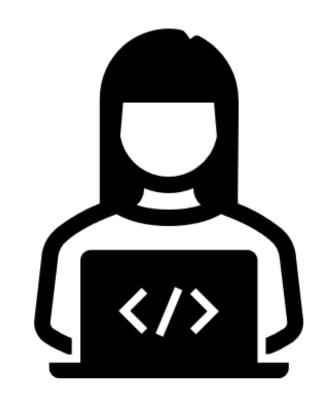
