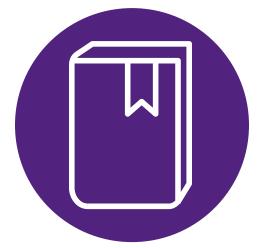
## Things to Know

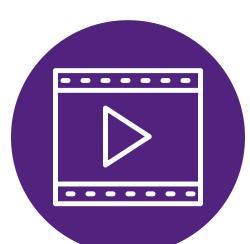
