



## Paper 1: Rhetorical Analysis <u>Building a Transnational View of Gender Through Documentary Film Analysis</u>

## Introduction:

Gender Equality, UN Sustainable Development Goal #5:

"Gender equality is not only a fundamental human right, but a necessary foundation for a peaceful, prosperous and sustainable world."

For this unit, we will explore gender equality around the globe through the lens of documentary film and a rhetorical analysis of that film. Rhetorical Analysis asks you to think about the **way** a subject is presented to an audience, not commenting on the film's content so much; rather, thinking about how the film is constructed to appeal to an audience within a special historical, cultural, social, and political context.

We will learn about audience. We will learn about the rhetorical appeals (ethos, pathos, and logos). Finally, we will learn about the rhetorical situation, and why it's important to research the historical, cultural, social, and political context of a speech, text, film, etc. You will apply this analytical lens to a documentary film of your choice and (1) either write a paper or (2) record an Adobe Spark video.

The goal for the entire class is to create a publication housing all of your projects. After these are complete, we will view the entire collection and reflection how we've represented gender equality as a class.
