Ethical Considerations

It is important that faculty and staff demonstrate integrity and professionalism at all times when collecting, using and/or discussing student data.

It is important to remember that, while data may represent attributes of real people, they do not describe the whole person (Each piece of data in a database represents an attribute of a real person, but these data cannot adequately portray all aspects of a multifaceted individual.)

Faculty and staff should be aware of the regulations, practices, and ethical standards governing data collection and reporting at Montgomery College. (Please see the attached slides related to Montgomery College policies and procedures on FERPA and the ethical use practices.)

Student information should be reported and used accurately and without bias. Faculty should use the information provided in the special class lists to support student success rather than pre-judge their academic ability.

Faculty and staff need to be accountable for the protection and ethical use of student data and should hold others accountable to ensure student data is protected.
